

First Reading - Isaiah 49:3, 5-6

The book of Isaiah in four different places speaks of a mysterious servant of God. This servant is sent to do great and marvelous things that touch the entire world. Christians have traditionally thought of Jesus as the fulfillment of these passages.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

For the next several Sundays our second reading will be taken from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians. Today's reading presents the opening words of that letter. It is an example of the salutation used in classical letter writing: Paul identifies himself, acknowledges the community to whom he is writing, and extends warm personal greetings.

SVDP Needs You!!

Our family of parishes St. Vincent de Paul Outreach is looking for a few new people to help us in our mission to provide a better home and surroundings for those in our community who are in need of assistance.



Our furniture ministry needs two or more facilitators to respond to Help Line callers who have requested furniture and household items. It is always surprising to see how many people live in an apartment with not a chair to sit in nor table to feed the family. We particularly want to see children in their own beds. An additional need is for a delivery person or two. These are the folks who take the beds and other items that are going to be delivered directly to the home of the family in need. The beds that we provide are "bed in a box" type - actually two boxes (the mattress in one and platform base in the other). They are small enough that a person with an SUV would be able to make a delivery. They are a bit heavy, so a second set of hands to help with taking the bed into the home may be needed on occasion. Often, the facilitator can request the recipient have someone in the home on delivery day to be the second set of hands. This allows the family to feel like they have participated in making a better life for themselves and their families. We currently have 3 facilitators and 3 or so delivery people. We normally deliver 5-10 beds per month. Our facilitators have close to 20 requests each month but many are satisfied without delivery of a bed. We have a lot of resources to assist with furniture needs. If either of these volunteer positions sound like something you'd like to do, please let us know. The work is rewarding and keeps us grounded to realize how many people need a helping hand. Your prayerful consideration of this way to spread God's love is appreciated. 
Today is the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time...The color green represents Ordinary

Time. Actually the word "ordinary" does not mean routine but "counted" or "ordinal" time.

Winter Ordinary Time is just a few short weeks before we enter the season of Lent. Summer and Fall Ordinary Time comprise the longest portion of the Liturgical Year, covering as much as six months of the Calendar. It is easy to mistakenly think the liturgical year is about sanctifying time. The truth, however, is that the liturgical year is about growing in relationship with Jesus Christ. The richness of Ordinary Time is found in the opportunity to know Christ more intimately in the everyday realities of life. The gospel readings proclaimed on these Sundays reveal the teaching and healing and mission of Christ, allowing us to better understand God who became human. We learn that Christ is about humility rather than pride, vulnerability rather than power. We learn that Christ is about including the excluded, eating with social and religious outcasts, and dismantling structures of sin and injustice. We learn that Christ is about self-giving love that is only possible through authentic relationship.

Ordinary Time is anything but monotonous. It is a time of conversion where we grow into who we are called to be by imitating the lived reality of Jesus.





January First Fruits Living


