#### Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma



During Lent, let us remember Jesus is waiting for us in the confessional. He wants to breathe new life into our hearts that wither from sin. With his grace, we will never tire of hearing the words "...may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen."

Why do we need to go to confession? We need to remember that our relationship with God should be the most important thing in our lives and that it requires communication and nurturing just like our marriages, friendships, work relationships, team relationships, etc. We have to get to know one another and practice our communication to grow the relationship. Sometimes, we say or do something that causes hurt to others. It's the same with God. As Pope Francis has stated in *Evangelii* Gaudium [The Joy of the Gospel, "Whenever we take a step toward Jesus, we come to realize that he is already there. waiting for us with open arms. Now is the time to say to Jesus: "Lord, I have let myself be deceived; in a thousand ways I have shunned your love, yet here I am once more, to renew my covenant with you. I need you. Save me once again, Lord, take me once more into your redeeming embrace." How good it feels to come back to him whenever we are lost! Let me say this once more: God never tires of forgiving us; we are the ones who tire of seeking his mercy."

# WHAT IF I HAVEN'T BEEN TO CONFESSION FOR MANY YEARS?

- First, don't be afraid. Jesus said, "Heaven rejoices more for one repentant sinner than for 99 righteous persons who never needed to repent."
- Second, try to prepare with the help of a Good Examination of Conscience.
- Third, get the largest sins off your shoulders first. Finally, don't wait.







A PRAYER OF SIMPLICITY

### **FOUR STEPS TO RECONCILIATONI**

- Step 1- Contrition -- Contrition is "sorrow of the soul and detestation for the sin committed, together with the resolution not to sin again."
- Step 2- Confession- The confession [disclosure] of sins, even from a simply human point of view, frees us and facilitates our reconciliation with others
- Step 3- Absolution- The priest speaks the words by which "God, the Father of mercies" reconciles a sinner to himself through the merits of the Cross
- Step 4 Satisfaction -- An important part of our healing is the "penance" the priest imposes in reparation for our sin.
