Easter is not just one day, but a season that continues for 50 days which ends on the great Feast of Pentecost

[Easter is a feast that lasts for 50 days, from the Resurrection of the Lord to Pentecost.] Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays, and Easter Time is the most important of all liturgical times. Easter is the celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. It is characterized, above all, by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death, expressed most fully in the great resounding cry of the Christian: Alleluia! All faith flows from faith in the resurrection:

"If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, is your faith." [1 Cor. 15:14]

The church is a direct result of real events in the course of human history. Without those real events, we simply follow a man who showed us a different way to live. Instead, we follow a God who emptied himself into a human form, suffered the pain of torture and death at the hands of those he had created, and then shattered the chains of death so that we in our human form may follow suit. Today, humanity is redeemed. It is time to face the facts!

The word **"Easter**" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "east". The sun that rises in the east, bringing light, warm and hope is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true light of the world. The Paschal Candle is a central symbol of this divine light which is Christ.
