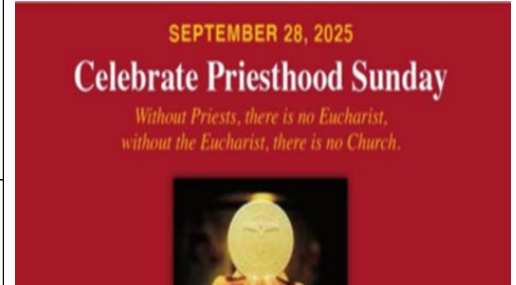

Why Family Faith Formation Program?

Catholic family faith formation programs are offered to equip and support parents as the primary educators of their children's faith, fostering a "domestic church" where faith is lived and passed on. These programs are based on the Church's teaching that parents are the first spiritual leaders in their families, aiming to deepen the faith of the entire family, build community, and form missionary disciples for Jesus Christ. Because Faith is best taught and lived out in the family, the Church calls parents to be the first and foremost educators of their children. Children are more likely to put into practice the faith they see lived out day-to-day at home.

¿Por qué un Programa de Formación en la Fe Familiar? --

Los programas Católicos de formación en la fe familiar se ofrecen para capacitar y apoyar a los padres como los principales educadores de la fe de sus hijos, fomentando una "iglesia doméstica" donde la fe se vive y se transmite. Estos programas se basan en la enseñanza de la Iglesia de que los padres son los primeros líderes espirituales en sus familias, con el objetivo de profundizar la fe de toda la familia, construir comunidad y formar discípulos misioneros para Jesucristo. Dado que la fe se enseña y se vive mejor en familia, la Iglesia llama a los padres a ser los primeros y principales educadores de sus hijos. Es más probable que los niños pongan en práctica la fe que ven vivir a diario en casa.
