Catechetical Corner RINCÓN CATEQUÉTICO

The Seven Sacraments: An Overview

The Catholic Church treasures the sacraments as visible signs of God's invisible grace. Instituted by Christ, they are not just symbols but channels through which we encounter the living God and receive His saving help. The Catechism tells us that the sacraments "touch all the stages and all the important moments of Christian life" [CCC 1210].

- The Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist—bring us into the life of Christ and His Church. Baptism cleanses us from sin and makes us children of God. Confirmation strengthens us with the Holy Spirit to bear witness. The Eucharist nourishes us with Christ's Body and Blood, the "source and summit" of our faith.
- The Sacraments of Healing—Penance [Confession] and Anointing of the Sick—restore us when sin or suffering weigh us down. In Reconciliation, Christ forgives and reconciles us. In Anointing, He comforts and strengthens the sick and dying.
- The Sacraments of Service—Holy Orders and Matrimony—consecrate us for mission. Holy Orders configures men to Christ the High Priest for service to God's people. Matrimony unites man and woman in a covenantal love that mirrors Christ's love for His Church. Together, the seven sacraments form a divine map guiding us from birth to eternal life, drawing us ever closer to Christ and His Church.
