October Social Justice Report



<u>Hunger is Scary! Social Justice Trick or Canning Event!</u> This year our focus is on extending our help to the people of White Earth. Our elementary through middle school kids will have a food drive on October 26th. The high school teens will help collect from the parish on the weekend of October 29-30. They will have curbside collection outside the Great Hall doors. Grocery bags are available the weekend prior to the event and our ushers will hand them out.

<u>Fair Trade</u>: Oct. 29-30 is our Fall Fair Trade and Sunday Breakfast sale. We will be offering products by gifted artisans around the world, a bake sale, and breakfast of pancakes, sausage, and eggs.

<u>Annual Social Justice Coat Drive</u> – Bins are located in the Gathering Space and office. Looking for new or gently used jackets and coats and new hats and mittens. No clothing please. Now through Oct. 30.

<u>Pow Wow Grounds Field Trip:</u> We are taking a short field trip to Pow Wow Grounds and Art Gallery in Mpls. On Nov. 17 at 9:30AM. We will carpool from St. Joe's. A chance to support the Native American Community, enjoy some beautiful art, and have a great cup of coffee! All are welcome!

<u>Wobble off Your Gobble!</u> A self guided walk to raise funds and awareness for Stepping Stone Emergency Shelter. Held Thanksgiving weekend, participants choose when, where, and how far to walk. There will be an information pamphlet available.

Believe Guatemala:

- *The kids are ending their school year this week. We celebrate having our first graduate!
- *The sewing program is doing really well and is talking about training in some new people. A small delegation will be going in December and we'll deliver a sewing machine and work on some visioning with them.
- * The commission that is working with FMSC is finishing up a leadership education program and then will set up a project for the community. They held their first distribution of food led completely by the leadership commission.
- *There are a few repairs we are working on and a major fundraising campaign is needed for a new vehicle. The old one is very unreliable and literally falling to pieces. It is needed to transport kids and staff to school and for outings as well as mission teams.

Comfort Buddies Project:

We hope to enlist the help of sewers in our parish to make some dolls and bears we can use to incentivize medical care and food. If a free doll or bear is offered there is a greater chance they will come into a clinic or to Believe where they can get the attention they need.

<u>Giving Trees:</u> The forms have been updated and are available at the front office for those who need them or know someone they can share them with.

<u>Loaves and Fishes</u>: We continue to serve large numbers – 280 people each month.

St. Joseph of the Lakes Finance Council Report October 11, 2022

Fiscal 2023 YTD September:

- Total collections are \$10k (<4%) under budget
- Festival resulted in \$100k of income, slightly better than budget
- Total expenses are \$66k under budget, largely due to timing of expenses
- Net cash position is ~\$200k
- Capital improvement fund is at \$279k
 - Capital Improvement fund is to be used for approved capital projects throughout the campus, such as A/C replacement, lighting, etc. It is typically not to be used for routine maintenance and repairs or special interest projects.
 - Cost for new A/C in church is estimated to be ~\$190k which will reduce this fund balance.

Other reminders:

Fiscal 2023 budget:

- Total collections budgeted to be relatively flat with this year at \$1.3M economic uncertainty is causing us to be cautious
- Parish festival budgeted at \$99k, about the same as this year
- Approximately \$40k is budgeted in Facility Maintenance and Improvement Fund to balance to a zero budget

Fiscal 2022 Year End:

- Ended the 2022 fiscal year with total Collections under budget by \$25k (<2% under budget)
- Parish festival (in August 2021) generated \$100k of income
- For the year, we put \$101k to the Facilities Maintenance & Improvement fund, a little more than we budgeted
- Capital Improvement fund was at \$274k at the end of June
- Net cash position was approximately \$105k
