- 1. **Opening Prayer**: The meeting was opened with prayer.
- 2. **Minutes** were approved with following change: 5 Commission Updates, d Facilities, iii. Exterior lighting is being looked at.
- 3. **Future Video Creation Process**: Guest: Rusty Ray (TV production professional/ Parishioner) and Communication Commission
 - a. Rusty works TV production and is a parishioner, hired to assist with videography-promotion at St. Joe's Church.
 - b. Rusty reviewed ways which St Joe's can utilize media to market and promote the parish.

 greeting. It was well received with positive feedback.
 - 2. Videos can also be unscripted (example shown of Social Justice Ministry while in Guatemala sending photos for use during weekend mass)
 - vi. Rusty encourages the parish to consider using these methods to promote our Parish in the community.
 - vii. Rusty has offered to work with all groups and ministries to promote and encourage, advertise events and assist us to create innovative ways to reach our community.
 - viii. A video example was viewed highlighting promotion.
 - ix. Advertise the opportunity we have to work with Rusty. We want parishioner to go through Anne in the office to connect with Rusty. Focuses might be: Faith Formation ad young families getting the word out about our faith programming, possible interviews with children.
