6. Commission updates: Pastoral Care, Charity and Justice, Faith Formation, Liturgy, Finance, Communications, Facility, Community Life and Synod.

Faith Formation

- We are in the late registration period for faith formation classes this year, so there's still an opportunity for families to join and be placed on a waitlist.
- We currently have about 70 students signed up for Confirmation (about 30 in Year 1, about 40 in Year 2); more than 180 signed up for Elementary and Middle School FF classes; and about 35 students signed up for Pre-K and Kindergarten FF classes.
- We have around 50 faith formation volunteers helping us this year across all of our programs, including several folks who are volunteering in more than one role. This is wonderful!
- Elementary/Middle School kick-off is Wed. Sept. 20th in the evening.
- Pre-K/Kinder FF begins Sept. 24th.
- Confirmation classes begin Oct. 1st.
- We currently have 3 family formation nights planned during this school year.
- Sarah Ray, St. Joe's new FF director, is getting connected with great people at the Archdiocese office and with other FF leaders at parishes in the archdiocese. She's grateful for the structure of ongoing support that is available and for everyone at St. Joe's who is helping her acclimate to her new role

Pastoral Care

- Catholic Studies program in the prison is in full swing and now being offered once a week. We have only been allowed in bi-weekly for one hour up until now, but now they've agreed to us being there weekly for one and half hours. In light of this news, we are currently in the process of building up our prison volunteer roster.
- There is a growing list of volunteers for homebound Communion, and we are fully stacked with Word and Communion services at our Senior Living facilities.
- Everyone who was waiting on a list for offsite sacraments has now been taken care of by Fr. Steve.
- Memorial Service is coming up in November
- Weekly adult faith formation classes kick off on Thursday, Sept. 28

St. Joseph of the Lakes Finance Council Report September 5, 2023

Fiscal 2023:

- Total collections were \$1.24M, which was \$71k (5%) under budget.
- Festival resulted in \$100k of income, slightly better than budget.
- Total income was \$104k under budget.
- Total expenses were \$104k under budget, to bring us to a net profit of \$0.
 - Salaries and benefits were \$106k under budget.
 - Lower spend on Parish Programs was offset by lower income received.
 - We added \$83k to the Facilities Improvement Fund for the year, which was \$44k more than budgeted.
- Net cash position is ~\$105k
- Capital improvement fund is at \$156k
 - Capital Improvement fund is to be used for approved capital projects throughout the campus, such as A/C replacement, lighting, etc. It is typically not to be used for routine maintenance and repairs or special interest projects.
 - Cost for new A/C in church was ~\$190k which reduced this fund balance.
- Loan for the parking lot has a balance of \$289k

Fiscal 2024 budget:

- Collections are budgeted to be flat with the Fiscal 2023 budget (we are currently 5% below budget in FY23)
- Festival is budgeted to bring in \$98k
- Budgeted salaries reflects an additional part-time clergy and ~3% merit increases
- Net profit is budgeted at \$0, with \$11k budgeted to the Facilities Maintenance & Improvement
 Fund to create a net zero budget

Policy for the posting of messages and images in the public spaces of Saint Joseph of the Lakes

Any poster or other media that any group (this includes staff, ministry groups, parish organizations and any others) that wishes to hang, place or distribute in the public areas of the church, gathering space, the public hallway of the parish office, the great hall and kitchen, St. Joe's hall, or parish grounds needs to be approved by the communication commission of the parish with the final approval resting with the pastor.

Any religious imagery to be displayed or hung or placed in the church, chapel or gathering area needs to be approved by the liturgy commission with the final approval resting with the pastor.

Any poster or other media that any group wishes to be hung, placed, or distributed in the faith formation building needs to be approved by the faith formation commission with the final approval resting with the pastor.

Any poster or other media that does not meet these criteria will be taken down and disposed of as it is noticed.
