I. GENERAL OVERVIEW:

Blessed is comprised of two sacramental preparation programs, one for First Reconciliation and one for First Communion. It consists of 42 short videos (DVD and/or online), a Leader's Guide, student workbook, and children's prayer card for each sacrament.

III. SPECIFIC RECOMMENDATIONS:

42 short animated files (DVD or online) for each – First Reconciliation and First Communion.

• 1 to 15 minutes each

Suggested 6 sessions for each sacrament

• 60 -90 minutes per session – can be shortened or lengthened, depending upon amount of time

Session Format

- 1. Opening Prayer
- 2. Teachable Moments (episodes 2,3, 4, 6)
- 3. From the Bible (episode 5)

- 4. Show what you know: quiz
- 5. Journal with Jesus: write or draw their thoughts to Jesus
- 6. Closing Prayer
- Focuses on emotional connection through animation.
- Does a great job of drawing students into the meaning of the sacraments, such as encouraging reverent behavior and helping the students enter into the liturgy.
- Presented in a practical way, with good application to life.
- Good quality videos and beautiful animated artwork in workbooks. However, also contains a lot of reading.
 - o Dialogue in the videos is almost directly from the textbook.
 - Teachers may need to find ways to include activities for other types of learning styles.
- With the use of animation, some things may need to be clarified, such as:
 - With the use of animal personifications, students may need to be reminded that animals cannot be baptized, commit sins, etc.
 - Session 3, Video 6 Children go into a dark tunnel without parent permission. May need to clarify safety precautions.
- The material is based on solid Church teaching; however, the publisher uses some unique terminology, such as "become the best version of yourself" instead of "become holy."
