SUMMER SOLIDARITY PROJECT "The Right to Read and to Dream"

Children from St. Michael Vacation Bible School and Ss. Peter & Paul VBS created one banner to present to our friends from El Salvador who will visit in August. Deanna Chappie facilitated this project, with "art assistance" from Jill Bornhorst. Total funds collected to be used for books in the library as of July 27, 2017 is \$481. Students from SM Vacation Bible School collected \$ 141 and other parishioners at St Michael donated an additional \$ 245. Ss. Peter & Paul parishioners donated \$ 65 and a donor from outside of Region sent a check for \$ 30. San Cristobal secured an additional \$300 from the Archdiocese of San Salvador for the library, and the youth of San Cristobal collected 21 books from other donors.

VISITORS FROM EL SALVADOR August 2-9

David Marcia and Augustin Fernandez are members of our sister parish in El Salvador. They spent a week in our pastoral region. Highlights included a tour of the University of Dayton VLCFF program, the libraries of Hardin Houston School, Fort Loramie Elementary, the town library. Other activities included kayaking on Lake Loramie, Dayton Dragons game, U.S. Airforce Museum, teaching Spanish language students to make Pupusas. This was a full English language immersion for them. Other opportunities that parishioners had to meet them included a presentation at both SM Parish Council at the hall, and at the Family Life Center at SPP. On Sunday evening, 25-30 people gathered to learn Cumbia, a popular dance in El Salvador. Augustine brought the banner back to El Salvador that students made during VBS. SHARE THE JOURNEY CAMPAIGN Sep 2017 - November 2019

In the story of Cain and Able, Holy Scripture reveals the origin of the fear of the other in the inability to understand and cherish difference. Scripture calls on us to overcome this fear, learn to welcome difference as richness and opportunity. Fleeing from the other is like fleeing from oneself. The relations between God, humanity and the earth are closely interconnected and determine our personal identity.

10,000 LETTERS November 11, 12, 2017

Archbishop Schnurr's goal was to send 10,000 Letters to Senators Sherrod Brown and Rob Portman to express support for legislation that provides a path to residency for the many immigrant youth. The letter outlines our belief in protecting the dignity of ever human being, especially that of our children and vulnerable. Among those protected by these bills are Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)

recipients, a program that has benefited over 780,000 young people across the country. Signatures were collected beginning after all masses on Nov 11 and 12. Our Pastoral Region collected 132 letters / signatures that were sent to Senators Portman and Brown. Ohio Churches, Schools, and organizations in Ohio collected nearly 15,000 letters/signatures in total that were mailed or delivered to our Ohio congressional representatives.

MISSIONARIES We started a discussion on how to promote, support and budget for Missionaries from our pastoral region. What does this look like? The discussion was tabled until the January meeting. *Financial support is provided for parishioners who travel to El Salvador.



Facilitated by CRISPAZ Christians for Peace in El Salvador

10-days, 9nights | Included in-country travel & housing, meals and translator. Cost of the program with CRISPAZ is \$950 per person. The cost of flights ranged from \$495 - \$620. The Mission Office provided \$350 for one person (a first time traveler to El Salvador), \$350 for the delegation coordinator and half of the cost for our guests from San Cristobal who traveled with us (\$80). Four parishioner's travel awards ranged from \$100-\$300. Participants include: Deanna Chappie (SPP), Rachel Bollheimer (SM), Theresa Garlock (St. Charles, Lima), Shari Eilerman (SM), Chuck Wray (SM), Dcn. Paul Timmerman and Ann Bollheimer (staff). A summary of the itinerary includes:

Tuesday, May 29th

- ♥ Santiago Nonualco is where the four U.S. church women were raped, killed and burred in a shallow grave in 1980 | Lunch at Santiago Nonualco with food prepared by the guesthouse
- We picked up a cake at the local bakery to celebrate Sonia's birthday (our host mom)
- ♥ Conversation with CRISPAZ Executive Director, Francisco Mena and closed with a reflection.

Wednesday, May 30th

- ♥ Conversation with members of COFAMIDE the Committee of Family Members of Migrants who have Died or Disappeared at the CRISPAZ office
- ♥ Lunch with Cofamide and the artisans
- ♥ Listened to the story of migrant who lived in Columbus, Oh for 3 years, and returned recently to El Salvador
- Juan Ramon Toledo from ALSARES Alianza de Salvadoreños Retornados (Aliance of Returned Salvadoran) talked with us about a new organization to help Salvadorans deported from the US

Thursday, May 31st

- Schicali is a cooperative run by differently abled people who make hand-crafted pottery.
- ♥ Divine Providence (Hospitalito) where Mons. Romero lived during his time as Archbishop, and where he was shot
- ♥ Encounter at the Hospitalito where delegation member's blood pressure dropped. Nun giving the tour provided a CRISPAZ cocktail, a sprig of Romero (rosmary) in a can of Sprite. IV fluids, medical forms were exchanged, IV fluids adminstered and out the door in 30-minutes - no charge
- ♥ Lunch at Nelly's with an opportunity to tap-out a tune of "Chop Sticks" on the rhumba. There was an applause and one generous patron gave a \$2 tip
- Jesuit campus of the University of Central America (UCA), the Centro Monseñor Romero museum and Rose garden dedicated to the Jesuit Martyrs and their two women collaborators (mother and daughter)
- ♥ Visit from Brian Rude, a missionary Lutheran pastor from Canada who's vocation brought him to El Salvador during the civil war



Friday, June 1st

- Friends from San Cristobal, Marinela, Franklin and David arrived at the guest house
- Metropolitan Cathedral: Spent some time in the crypt where the body of Monsignor Oscar Romero is entombed in a larger than life-size bronze sculpture, of this soon-to-be saint.
- School sponsored in part by Catholic Relief Services. The school administers the Youth Builder Program.

SISTER PARISH PROGRAMS

On Sunday afternoon, June 3, 2018 San Cristóbal's multi-purpose room was full of life, as the delegation from our pastoral region arrived after lunch to see what was all going on. The room was very loud, but the students were focused on whatever was in front of them. Adults and children were working on computers with the English program in the center of the hall. Participants of the VLCFF adult faith formation program were making the most noise in the front of the room, as the audio from the video echoed throughout the hall. The students of the computer program were working quietly in the back, while a group of adults were working on a different set of computers.

Opportunities to learn and to dream in a safe space in El Salvador is not a common place. The financial assistance from our pastoral region covers the costs of basic program expense, and the leadership in San Cristobal is necessary for these projects to continue.

SUMMER SOLIDARITY PROJECT July 8 – July 29 Both St. Michael VBS and Ss. Peter & Paul VBS participated. Deanna Chappie and Ann facilitated the learning stations for VBS at both parishes. This included a 15-20 min learning station each day on Caring for God's Creation, with a focus on the monarch Butterfly. See the flyers for details. With the rainforest being the theme of St Michael VBS, participants learned that the rain forest is far away, but the decisions that we make in Ohio affect the rain forest. The monarch butterfly migrates to Mexico in the winter. All summer, it lays its eggs on the common milkweed and the larva eats the leaves - it is the only plant that it lays its eggs. This is a

- ▼ THURSDAY Daniel Francis joined us again, and participants learned about different pollinator plants.
- ♥ A pollinator garden and an American Rose Bud tree (Ana's tree) was planted behind St. Michael's old Cemetery. A pollinator garden was planted next to the utility shed at SPP along with a ninebark bush.
- FRIDAY (SM only) Deanna summed up the Solidarity Project with El Salvador Rain Forest: El Impossible National Park: Deana showed photos from the delegation in June.
 DONATIONS from VBS Participants for this project include: St Michael \$126 | Ss. Peter & Paul \$4.00 EXPENSES: Sodcutter \$80; American Redbud \$26 (SM); Ninebark & materials for soil prep \$60 (SPP).
 400 Packs of seeds of pollinators donated by the Ohio Pollinator Habitat were available at both churches for parishioners to plant. Fifty two families from children who participated with St Michael VBS requested packs. As of July 24, only 40 packets remained at St. Michael Church (I do not have the count for SPP)

Romero, El Salvador's First Saint

ROME - Pope Francis has chosen the date for the ceremony that will see the Catholic Church officially recognize the sainthood of Pope Paul VI and Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador, who was martyred as he was celebrating Mass.

They will be canonized on Oct. 14, 2018. The October ceremony, to be celebrated by Francis, will be in Rome, during the Synod of Bishops on the youth that will take place from October 3 to 28, 2018.

Oscar Romero, who will become the first Salvadoran saint, was born on August 15, 1917. He was gunned down during Mass in a hospital chapel March 24, 1980, a day after telling an army made up largely of peasants that they were killing their own people. "No soldier is obliged to obey an order that is contrary to the will of God," he said. He was shot through the heart by gunmen linked to a right-wing death squad while celebrating Mass, after saying, "one must not love oneself so much as to avoid getting involved in the risks of life that history demands of us, and those who fend off danger will lose their lives."

Romero was outspoken against military oppression during his country's bloody civil war in the 1980s, and also of the role the United States played in it.

In a letter he sent to U.S. president Jimmy Carter in February of 1980, he urged America not to send military aid to El Salvador: "You say that you are Christian. If you are really Christian, please stop sending military aid to the military here, because they use it only to kill my people."

His death is considered by the Catholic Church to have been in "odium fidei," meaning in hatred of the faith.

Romero was beatified in San Salvador on May 23, 2015, in a ceremony that drew an estimated 250,000 people, believed to have been the largest religious gathering ever held in Central America
