- 3. We will educate and bring awareness of the Church's Catholic Social Teachings and its foundations in the Gospels through multi- media (bulletin, newsletter, website, etc.), student religious education programs, speakers, workshops, retreats, events, reflections, and prayer.
- 4. We will coordinate, and support the existing charity and justice organizations in our NFL Pastoral Region while maintaining effective communication and collaboration between ministries.
- 5. We will organize and create opportunities to empower people to have a personal relationship with Jesus through personal encounters with people who are poor (in mind, body, & spirit), vulnerable, and/or marginalized through ministries of charity and justice.
- 6. We will emphasize the "Option for the Poor and Vulnerable" by pursuing issues which address the dignity and rights of people who are socially, politically, or economically disadvantaged.
- 7. We will add our voice to change structures in our society which restrict justice and peace, through legislative advocacy.
- 8. We will give priorities to strategies which enable people to realize and act on their own power.

Commission Structure

- 1. The Outreach Commission includes ministries of pastoral care, social services, evangelization and peace and justice. It's scope includes outreach to parish membership as well as the local and global community.
- 2. It is imperative that the Outreach Commission has an effective and collaborative relationship with the leadership of Worship, Education, Finance, and Buildings and Grounds.
- 3. The Commission is comprised of up to 12 members, with at least four members from each parish in the pastoral region, each serving a three year term, with an option for a second term. Each year a review of membership will either elect new, or renew Commission members.
- 4. Each outreach ministry or project will have a chairperson or contact person to report to and collaborate with the Commission and its represented project or ministry.

These individuals will have priority for Commission membership.

5. The commission meets quarterly and reports to both St Michael and Ss. Peter & Paul Pastoral Councils.
