PLANNING THE MASS OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL

This booklet was prepared by the parish community of Saint Rita to assist your family in planning the Mass of Christian Burial for your loved one. We hope that by choosing the readings and music, you and your family might share more fully in the liturgy, and express your care and love for the deceased. Enclosed with this booklet is a **LITURGY PLANNING FORM**, to be returned to the priest presiding at the funeral Mass. Please fill-out the form and return it to the priest/Parish Office as soon as possible. If you need assistance, a parish staff member will gladly provide help. Be assured of the prayers and concern of our parish during this time of sorrow.

CATHOLIC FUNERALS

In the face of death, the Church confidently proclaims that God created each person for eternal life and that Jesus, the Son of God, by his death and resurrection, broke the chains of sin and death that bound humanity. The Order of Christian Funerals is divided into three rites that correspond to the three ritual movements in the funeral of Christians. These three movements form one procession from the funeral home, to the church, then to the cemetery. It includes: The Vigil Service (wake), Funeral Liturgy, and Rite of Committal. It is customary that the funeral of a Christian includes these three movements. Although this is customary, other options may be available.

CREMATION

In 1963, the Catholic Church lifted prohibitions against the practice of cremation and revised the rites for services with cremated remains. While the Church prefers cremation after the funeral liturgy, it realizes that financial constraints or other circumstances may result in cremation before the funeral service. The cremated remains can be brought into the church for the funeral Mass, and may be accompanied by a picture of the deceased, if desired. A minister will accompany the cremated remains to the cemetery for committal after the funeral. The Church teaches that the ashes of the faithful are to be buried, or interred in a sacred place, such as a mausoleum or columbarium. The Church strictly forbids other methods of disposal of a person's ashes such as: "the conservation of the ashes of the departed in a domestic residence is not permitted...the ashes may not be divided among various family members." (Ad Resurgendum cum Christo [To Rise with Christ], Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, par. 6) "[It] is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea, or in some other way, nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jew-

INVITATION TO PRAYER

SONG OF FAREWELL

A song is sung as the casket is being incensed; a sign of our prayers, thoughts and petitions rising up to God and an acknowledgment of the sacred nature of the body.

PRAYER OF COMMENDATION

The Presider prays that the angels lead the deceased into paradise, the martyrs come to welcome him/her and take him/her to the holy city, the new and eternal Jerusalem.

RECESSIONAL

The Church's recommended text/hymn is: In Paradisum, the traditional Catholic funeral chant for processing from church with the body. This will be used if no other preference is indicated. Other suggested hymns are listed on the **LITURGY PLANNING FORM**.

elry or other objects." (Ad Resurgendum cum Christo, par. 7) Since the Church teaches that human beings are composed of both body and soul, it holds the remains of our deceased loved ones in great esteem. As Catholics, we believe that at Christ's coming in glory, we will be reunited with our bodies and live in a new creation. Thus, whether one chooses cremation or traditional burial, it is important that your loved one's body be shown proper respect.

TIMES FOR FUNERAL MASSES

According to diocesan guidelines, funeral Masses can be held on any day of the year except Sunday, a Holy Day, or during the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday). The usual time for funerals at Saint Rita is 10:00 AM.

MASS PROGRAM BOOKLETS

Funeral programs are not necessary since most hymns selected for funerals are found in our hymnal. Saint Rita does have a standard funeral program and will supply copies for your guests, as long as the necessary information is received in the Parish Office in a timely fashion. Should you, as a family, desire to develop and print a program on your own, you are welcome to do so. We ask that you do follow copyright laws when designing the program. If you need assistance in this area, please contact the Parish Office.

MINISTERS

Readers: Family members or friends are encouraged to proclaim the readings at the funeral Mass and to read the General Intercessions (petitions). Please try to choose individuals with clear speaking voices, as the Word proclaimed is meant to bring comfort to those who have gathered to pray. It is helpful to give your chosen reader a copy of the reading before the liturgy, so that they may prepare in advance. If you wish the parish to provide readers to proclaim the Scriptures, please indicate this on the planning form.

Musician and Servers: Our pastoral staff will contact both the musician and altar servers. Other instrumentalists are available to you if you desire them. Please call our Parish Office to make arrangements for additional instrumentalists and/or vocalists. Additional stipends may be appropriate.

Visiting Priests: Visiting priests are welcome to concelebrate and take part in the Mass at the discretion of the presiding priest from Saint Rita. Clergy from other Dioceses or Religious Orders are requested to obtain a letter of good standing from their Chancellor or Superior.

STIPENDS

It is customary that the family provide an offering to the Church. The usual donation for a funeral Mass is \$450. This is typically paid through the funeral director, and is meant to cover the services of the musician, the celebrant, and the Church. This is not required in order to receive a Christian burial. If there is a problem with finances, please speak with your funeral director and the celebrant.

MEMORIAL OFFERINGS

Masses for the intentions of the deceased may be requested through our parish or any parish church. The normal stipend for a Mass intention is \$10. Saint Rita Parish can schedule four (4) Masses a year per household based on availability. The large number of requests for Mass intentions precludes us from scheduling more. Additional Mass intentions may be distributed to the missions or retired priests. If you would like to honor your loved one by making donations to a special fund or ministry, please let us know. We discourage individual purchases of memorial vessels and vestments since this often results in duplication of items at the parish.

BEQUESTS

Gifts in honor of your deceased loved one help us to further the mission of the Church. We have envelopes available for such gifts. Many people prefer to request donations in lieu of flowers.

MASS OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL

GREETING

The priest, ministers, and assembly greet the body toward the back of the Church, symbolizing their life in the Church.

CHRISTIAN SYMBOLS

After the body is greeted at the entrance to the church, blessed holy water is placed on the casket. This holy water reminds us of the saving waters of baptism. Its use calls to mind the deceased's baptism and initiation into the community and the newness of life into which he/she is now called. Immediately following, a white cloth or "pall" is placed on top of the casket. This cloth symbolizes the baptismal garment of our Catholic faith. Family members are encouraged to take part in this ritual. The casket will then begin the procession to the front of the church near the Paschal Candle, the sign of the light of Christ and the eternal life into which we entered at baptism.

OPENING SONG-PROCESSIONAL

The Church's recommended text/hymn is: Give him/her eternal rest, O Lord. This will be used if no other preference is indicated. Other appropriate song choices are suggested on the planning form. These selections are chosen from the hymnal used at Saint Rita. Any special requests will need to be approved by the Music Director before the liturgy. Seasonal music is appropriate during the liturgical seasons of the year, i.e. Easter music during the Easter season, Christmas carols during the Christmas season, etc. Note: all songs that contain the word *Alleluia* are inappropriate during the Lenten season.

REMARKS OF REMEMBRANCE (EULOGY)

There are times when a family member or friend may wish to speak in memory of a deceased one, or read a favorite poem or prayer. This option is not necessary. Due to time restraints and the setting of a funeral Mass, the remarks or readings should be brief. We limit these remarks to less than four minutes. More extensive remarks are more appropriately made at the Funeral Home, at the Grave site, or the dinner following the funeral. For further information, speak with the celebrant.

OPENING PRAYER (READ BY CELEBRANT)

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING

The first reading is typically taken from the Hebrew Scriptures, or the "Old Testament". Please choose one of the following readings and indicate your choice on the **LITURGY PLANNING FORM.** The chosen reading will be placed on the Ambo for the reader, he/ she should not bring any paper with him/her when they approach the altar.

A-1 A Reading from the book of Job

Jb. 19:1, 23-27

Job answered and said: Oh, would that my words were written down! Would that they were inscribed in a record: That with an iron chisel and with lead they were cut in the rock forever! But as for me, I know that my Redeemer lives, and that he will at last stand forth upon the dust; Whom I myself shall see: my own eyes, not another's, shall behold him, and from my flesh I shall see God; my inmost being is consumed with longing.

The Word of the Lord

A-2 A reading from the book of Wisdom Wis. 3:1-9

The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace. HOMILY

The homily breaks open the Word of God and helps relate it to the life of the deceased. Family members may wish to write down some notes about the deceased to share with the priest. These notes should be turned in to the Parish Office along with the **LITURGY PLANNING FORM**.

These prayers may be offered by a family member or friend. Please choose one of the three options below, indicate your choice on the **LITURGY PLANNING FORM**. The traditional response to the general intercession is: "Lord Hear Our Prayer." The priest will introduce and conclude the intercessions with a prayer.

Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

D-15 A reading from the holy gospel according to John Jn 11:32-45

When Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?" So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, he cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go." Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

D-11 A reading from the holy gospel according to John Jn 5:24-29

Jesus answered the Jews and said to them: Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes in the one who sent me has eternal life and will not come to condemnation, but has passed from death to life. Amen, amen, I say to you, the hour is coming and is now here when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. For just as the Father has life in himself, so also he gave to his Son the possession of life in himself. And he gave him power to exercise judgment, because he is the Son of Man. Do not be amazed at this, because the hour is coming in which all who are in the tombs will hear his voice and will come out, those who have done good deeds to the resurrection of life, but those who have done wicked deeds to the resurrection of condemnation.

D-12 A reading from the holy gospel according to John

Jn 6:37-40

Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me. And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day."

D-13 A reading from the holy gospel according to John Jn 5:51-58

I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us (his) flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. He has made everything appropriate to its time, and has put the timeless into their hearts, without men's ever discovering, from beginning to end, the work which God has done. I recognized that there is nothing better than to be glad and to do well during life. For every man, moreover, to eat and drink and enjoy the fruit of all his labor is a gift of God. I recognized that whatever God does will endure forever; there is no adding to it, or taking from it. Thus has God done that he may be revered.

Now that very day two of them were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. [He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the scriptures.] As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

D-7 A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke Lk 12:35-40 Jesus said to his disciples:

"Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large. On entering the tomb they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed. He said to them, "Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold the place where they laid him.

D-6 A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke Lk 7:11-17

Soon afterward he journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him.
