


FINANCIAL SUMMARY REPORT



The first thing that is obvious from the numbers is **Income > Expenses!!!** This of course makes your pastor ©. Since many ministry positions went unfilled last year, this accounts for some of the financial gains. The <u>parish staff</u> is to be commended for accepting additional duties to make this a reality. Another contribution to the surplus is <u>YOU</u>, the parishioners. This was the first year Holy Family has met the budgeted Sunday Collection amount since 2009-10. Collections were up 3.8% over 2017-18 fiscal year. That is a great sign of your renewed generosity. Thank you and please continue. These increased revenues have helped fund some of the <u>improvements</u> that are visible around campus.

A Few Other Insights from the Financial Summary

Many parish and school members contributed to the *Legacy Capital Campaign* which assisted with the renovation of the 1961 middle school wing. This extraordinary income of \$152,766 helped pay toward the overall project costs of approximately \$375,000. The remainder is being paid from remaining funds from the 1954 renovation project last summer, funds from the *Legacy for our Mission* campaign in 2008, and general parish savings. In addition to the long-term capital improvements of the parish and school facilities, the parish directly subsidizes the operation of our parish school ministry. In 2018-19, this subsidy was \$250,447 (31.5% of Sunday collections) plus a \$73,827 subsidy to Providence HS.

Holy Family also supported associated ministries of the parish.

St Vincent de Paul received \$6,284 in cash donations through the parish, not including food/furniture contributions. **In Heaven's Eyes** received \$9,544 plus hundreds of dedicated volunteer hours serving



Christ in the needy of our community. The *Catholic Cemeteries of New Albany* also receive \$7,936 in parish/parishioner support.

While collections were up, I would encourage everyone to prayerfully consider if their annual financial support of the parish (and school) is truly a sacrificial offering to God from the inestimable gifts God has entrusted to you. Now is a good time to increase your giving, especially if you are among the 22.5% of households who made no trackable contribution. "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much,

and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more" (Lk 12:48). A special thank you to the 139 households (26.4%) that use on-line donations through Faith Direct! Increased, reliable, financial resources allow the parish leadership to plan for the future and to implement new ministerial initiatives to make the Kingdom of Heaven ever more visible in our parish, our community, and our county.

Parish Spiritual Life

Nearly **40** people began the <u>Great Adventure Bible Timeline study</u> lead via DVD by Jeff Cavins. This fantastic overview of the whole of the Scriptures and Salvation History walks through the Bible from Genesis to Revelations. The Holy Family study group began meeting in March with participants joining either a morning or evening group on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month. This group was begun by members of the parish with a hunger for Scripture! New participants are welcome to join.





Lent 2019 was a new experience for many here at Holy Family. Our prolonged <u>Eucharistic Adoration</u> was a tremendous success and huge spiritual boost to our parish and individual people. We had more than 100 members of the parish commit to an hour of prayer before

Christ Truly Present in the Eucharist. Many others simply stopped in when they had time, some nearly every day. It is estimated that more than 1000 hours were spent in prayer with Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. What a response! There

was also a Preached Holy Hour each Tuesday of Lent plus we offered our first Divine Mercy Sunday Holy Hour with 75 people in attendance. Stations of the Cross were well attended. Lent was a blessed season for Holy Family.

I didn't realize how much I longed for quiet time with Jesus & the Bible until this experience. I tried to sub as often as possible and looked forward to my scheduled time. God showed me how healing an hour of quiet & focus on His Son could be.

Holy Family Catholic Faith Formation (CFF)

The CFF program for parish children met monthly for family Bible study and catechetical instruction. We began incorporating a new Family Catechesis

component called "Finding God" during Advent and Lent. CFF helped prepare six children from the parish to receive their First Reconciliation and Holy Communion.

Children of three HF School families

enter the Catholic Church by Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion in *Christian Initiation of Children (CIOC)* program. Theresa Shaw worked with these families through CFF and their school formation to be ready for the Easter Vigil.



Theresa Shaw also worked to introduce and offer *LoveEd* to parents and 5th graders of the school and CFF to learn about God's plan for love and intimacy.

Holy Family Catholic School and Preschool – Home of the Eagles



The 2018-19SY was momentous for Holy Family School. The summer leading into 2018-19 and the summer concluding were dominated by renovations of the entire 2nd floor of the 1954 school wing and the 1962 middle school wing. These two upgrades set the tone for an exciting, energetic, and excellent school year. The students were enlivened spiritually by Fr. Gries' homilies, weekly Sacrament of Reconciliation, Lenten Eucharistic Adoration, and a high visible

priest presence at HFS during the day and sports events. The school year saw new staffing and systems enhance the parish community and Catholic education experience for all on the Holy Family campus.

Turning the old into new was a theme in the physical facilities of the school. The renovation of eight classrooms and hallway of the 1954 school marked the first major physical improvements in 65 years.





"Mr. Fred" Williams was a longtime HFS staff member, serving students in our classrooms, childcare and after-school care programs. With his wife Sue, Fred was an active parishioner, school parent and grandparent, CYO coach, and benefactor. In 1989, the Williams family established the John Thomas Williams Memorial Scholarship, named for their son who died during his 8th grade year at HFS. For 30 years, the scholarship has helped 79 HFS graduates attend Providence High School. "Mr. Fred", may you forever rest in the peace of Christ.

Spanish Language Classes and Support for Spanish Speaking Families

Holy Family has a long-standing tradition of providing foreign language instruction. HFS currently provides Spanish language and culture across the primary level up to high school Spanish I for our 8th graders. In 2018-19, HFS made a significant step forward by adding English Language Learners (ELL) additional support with an on-site ELL Interventionist. For the 2019-20SY, HFS has added a Spanish speaking Pre-School assistant to further enhance our ability to instruct all children, both native English



and Spanish speaking students. In a true Holy Family manner, three sisters – Sonia, Brenda, and Cristina Velasco – are providing this expertise and instruction at HFS! With their combined 8 children at HFS, they are making a transformative difference! Muchas Gracias, Senoras!

Affordable Catholic Education – HFS strives to make a quality Catholic Education affordable for all children by many means:

- Holy Family parish subsidy offsets tuition by \$1000 / student
- HFS Gala & Walkathon reduce tuition by \$400 / student
- Parish and School Tuition Assistance assists middle/low income parishioner families
- *Indiana School Choice* provides 50-90% tuition vouchers for qualifying families
- School Granting Organization (SGO) scholarships up to \$5,000 for qualifying families
- Free/Reduced Lunch program through the Federal Government
- Grants through Federal Title programs, Horseshoe Foundation, and State of Indiana provide services, equipment and teacher professional development at no extra cost to the school



In 2018-19, **Seventy-Two HFS students** benefited from either an Indiana School Choice Scholarship ("Voucher") or an SGO tax credit scholarship. Nearly 14% of our students received free/reduced lunch benefits.
