Be strong and steadfast! Do not fear nor be dismayed, for the LORD, your God, is with you wherever you go.

~ Joshua 1:9

This verse comes at the start of the Book of Joshua. Joshua picks up the mantel of leadership from Moses and is tasked with leading the Israelites from the desert into the Promised Land. A Land promised to them in the past through Abraham but a land very much occupied by others in the present. The life, leadership, and literary arc of Joshua tells the struggles, hardships, and challenges faced by the Israelites, even while it shows the nearness of the Lord in and through the whole journey. Joshua and the Israelites were successful to the extent that they were faithful. The more they trusted in the Lord God, the more they advanced.

We are not Israelites. We are not called to conquer, in a worldly sense, the nations around us so as to take physical possession of lands or peoples. Such an idea may even sound strange or strangely abhorrent to our modern ears. But we are a people called to be strong and steadfast. We are a people called to invade the world around us with the Promise of God given us as free Gift from the Saving Cross of Christ. We, as much as if not more than the Israelites under Joshua, need to be strong and steadfast, courageous and bold. Not to conquer others but to convey the Truth of Jesus Christ through the Church. To proclaim the Scriptures and provide the Sacraments. To encourage deep, meaningful, encounter with Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and Liturgy. To enhance deep, meaningful relationships among fellow Christians. To extend deep, meaningful accompaniment, answers, and attention to a world very much in need of the all-conquering Love, Mercy, Forgiveness, and Discipline of Jesus Christ. Do you believe in that message? Do you accept its innate power to change others for the good, for God? Our answers need to be strong and steadfast. We cannot give into fear or dismay. We must trust that the Lord God is with us as we go forth.

In many ways, this verse today beautifully foreshadows Jesus resolute journey to Jerusalem (Lk 9:51). Or better yet, Jesus perfectly fulfills and completes what Joshua began – to be God with us – Emmanuel – wherever we go. And where else can we go, but with Christ to the Cross of redemption so as to experience with Christ the Empty Tomb of resurrection. This, sisters and brothers, is the journey we are on each and every day of our Christian lives.

The past 2021-22 year was no different. Good and Godly things happened here at Holy Family to help folks walk with Christ to the Cross: Magdalenes, RCIA, 40-Hours Advent Adoration, Exodus 90, First Communion preparation, Marriages, Baptisms, Fridays-for-Fathers, Divine Mercy Holy Hour, small-group Confirmation preparation, NCYC participation, pre-Mass Rosary recitations, restoration of nursing home visits, increased children participating in our Catholic school, return of Children's Liturgy of the Word, increased Mass attendance, and more. Each in its own unique way leading us closer to Christ, helping us follow in His holy footsteps along the Journey to the New Jerusalem.

It is good to look back every once and a while. It is often then that we can see how the Lord God is indeed with us wherever we go. And this looking back, makes us strong and steadfast for the pathway ahead. Lord, lead us on!





This good news married with strong school enrollment and continued careful management of expenses has further strengthened the position of the parish. I'm biased, but the spirit of the parish and parishioners seems strong, vibrant, and inviting. Increased involvement is met with increased support across all measures. Thank you for your continued faith-filled generosity and commitment to the Parish & School.

The parish & school invested in the installation of new HVAC in the cafeteria. This project is 75% complete. We are awaiting equipment delivery to finish. This is the first of three stages over the next several years to eventually replace our 68-year-old boiler system. The replacement will provide increased seasonal flexibility and efficiency.

### **Parish Spiritual Life**

A new women's ministry named *Magdalenes* began in Fall 2021. We are made for community – relationship with God and with others. Magdalenes exists to provide space for just that: prayer and friendship. Women of all ages gather for a video, prayer, and discussion about a topic of faith in a small grounds.

Adoration was held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month from 9 a.m. -9 p.m. During Lent Adoration was offered Monday - Friday each week. We also held 40 Hours with Mary waiting for Jesus (40 Hours Advent Adoration) at the beginning of December as a way to prepare our hearts-minds-souls for the Birth of our Savior Jesus Christ.



#### **Holy Family Childrens Faith Formation (CFF)**

The CFF program for parish children met monthly for family Bible study and catechetical instruction. 19 children from the school and parish were prepared to receive their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion.

*Totus Tuus* (Totally Yours) was held again this year and was well received. For the first time, there was collaboration from six parishes in the Catholic Community of Jeffersonville to put it together, and was hosted at the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The children participated in games, songs, Sacraments, and prayer.

And, oh yes, they had a lot of fun along the way. Many parishioners from all parishes were involved by hosting the team of missionary adults in their homes for the week, for an evening dinner with their families, donating and preparing snacks for the children, and more. It was truly a multi-parish endeavor!





In April we announced that after 17 years of service, our Director of Family Faith Formation and cherished member of the Holy Family Theresa Shaw would be required to take permanent medical-induced leave and, in essence, retire from Holy Family as she continues her battle with cancer.
