With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you not only the Gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us. ~ I Thessalonian 2:28

During the course of my recent sabbatical, I spent some time with this passage in prayer. It jumped out at me as I was prayerfully reading my way through some of the New Testament epistles. Christ wanted to challenge me – and us – with it. As Catholic Christian faithful, we've hear, at least I've said often enough, that we are all called to help spread the Gospel. We've heard Jesus Christ's Great Commission (Mt 28:19) to "Go make Disciples, baptizing them... and teaching them all that I commanded you." Essential to our own baptism is this call to witness to and evangelize others with Gospel Good News. We are to share it with others. St Paul is affirming this fact in the in his letter to the Catholic Christian community in Thessalonica. He was determined to share the Gospel of God and to do so with affection. For what greater love is there than to assist another in attending to their salvation in Christ. That is a love that has an eternal impact for good.

Yet, the part that really challenged me, and something I think worth reflection on together, is that we Catholic Christians are not called by Paul's example and exhortation merely to share the external 'object' or 'thing' of the Gospel, as if we could hand a tangible Bible over to another and say "Here, there you go! You've got it now". But we are called to share "our very selves" with the other as essential to our witness, evangelization, and love of neighbor. While each of us will experience a particular judgement, we live the Gospel in Community with others. And this entails a sharing of self.

This should not surprise us. After all, our Savior came in the Flesh, to share Himself with us personally, tangibly, substantially. His was not just a message of Good News (it is that), but also a shared personal encounter with Good News in His Person. A person who shared – and sacrificed – that very self for us upon the Cross and then rose on the Third Day. We, Christians, are called to do the same. We can't just give away the message of Jesus; we must be Jesus given away in our very selves to others. St Paul understood this truth only too perfectly.

It is this same truth that we encounter in the Eucharist. There we encounter not a what, an 'object' or 'thing', but a WHO – our Lord Jesus Christ – Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity, truly, really, substantially, Sacramentally present. It is in the Mass when we gather that we experience Jesus sharing not just His Word through the Scriptures but His very self – "Take this all of you and eat it. It is my Body" (Mt 26:26). Jesus is the one who first shared the Gospel and then His very self. St Paul did likewise (and was the first to write about this Eucharist sharing and unity in the Body, Cf. I Corinthians 11-12). And we, the Catholic Christians of the today, are meant to carry it forward by sharing both the Gospel and our very selves.

This we do in many marvelous ways through the members & ministries of *Holy Family* Parish and School. Each year, when we compile the "State of the Parish" report, I'm amazed at both the normal ways and the new and varied ways we find to share the Gospel and, yes, our very selves with those around us. 2022-23 once again showed that the Holy Family family excels in this good and holy undertaking of sharing the Gospel, forming intentional disciples, engaging in fellowship and serving others. And we do it by the gift of our very selves, one to another and one to the community. Praise God! May He make us nothing less than saints!



#### **Ordinary Parish Income**





At fiscal year-end, Sunday Offerings decreased slightly by 1.6% year-over-year. However, this was offset by substantial increases in "Other Donations". The year-end report shows a deficit, but that is due to substantial facilities investments incurred as part of ordinary operations. When Extraordinary Income from both designated donations and requests are included (not shown here), the deficit is just \$10,630 (0.35%). Given inflation impacts and tangible improvements in parish spaces, this was a good year. The school is operationally more self-sustaining, pews are fuller, faith formation offerings better attended. We are on the right track.

The parish & school made several facility improvements. Two new roofs were installed due to persistent leaks. A new gym floor was installed. Four humanities classrooms were refreshed, including HVAC upgrades and converting two to Second Gr classrooms. This was driven by recent growth and the planned transition away from our 69-year-old boiler. This is the second of three stages to eventually replace the boiler.

#### Parish Spiritual Life

#### Women's Ministry

Magdalenes held two series this year - one in the fall and one in the spring. At least 50 women participated in each series. New this summer, we held monthly stand-alone events including a Magdalenes night on the Eucharist, Adoration, and a Potluck. Approximately 20 women connected and prayed with one another throughout the summer.



#### **Adult Studies**

This year, we began offering adult faith formation studies on Thursday evenings. From January through March, 48 adults gathered to study "What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith". From April through May, a second study, "A Walk through the Mass," was offered with 25 participants.

#### Holy Family's Family Night

This year Faith Formation and Youth Ministry teamed up to offer Family Nights - following Mass, families gathered for Adoration with guided prayers and music, followed by food and fun!



Adoration was held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month from 9 a.m. – 9 p.m. During Lent Adoration was offered Monday – Friday each week. We also held 40 Hours with Mary waiting for Jesus (40 Hours Advent Adoration) at the beginning of December as a way to prepare our hearts-minds-souls for the Birth of our Savior Jesus Christ.





#### **Children's Faith Formation (CFF)**

Nine families gathered monthly from October through May. Parents and children reflected on the Sunday readings together and split by age group for catechetical formation. 14 children from the school and parish prepared for and celebrated their First Reconciliation and First Communion.

#### Vacation Bible School (VBS) & Totus Tuus

The week of June 25-30 nearly 100 Deanery children in Pre-K through High School participated in VBS or Totus Tuus (Totally Yours) at St. Anthony Parish. Our collaborative faith formation opportunity brought to life salvation history for our young people. Pre-K through Kindergarten children participated in traditional VBS stations, including Bible stories, crafts, games, music, rosary, and snacks. child by teaching LEADERSHIP to every student, creating a CULTURE of student empowerment, and aligning systems to drive results in ACADEMICS.


