

Wisconsin Parental Choice Program Information

- Families who are currently enrolled in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) may start to register on Thursday, February. 1st. Mr. Brown will send out more information to everyone in the coming weeks.
- I have found this link helpful for families over the years if you have questions. This is last year's information, but the information will be the same except for income.

- **3.** If you are currently enrolled in the program, you do not need to fulfill the financial requirements to be a part of the program. Only new families need to meet the financial requirements. If you are in the program this year, you will be automatically in the program next year. You will need to apply again, and provide residency requirements.
- 4. Several families have asked for the financial requirements for new families next year. All information can be found in the flyer provided at the end of this Knightly News.
- 5. St. Joseph School is a part of all three Choice Programs. The Milwaukee Parental Choice Program (MPCP) and the Racine Parental Choice Program (RPCP) are only for families who live in those respective communities. If you do not live in those communities, you are eligible for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program.
- 6. Current 3K, 4K and 5K families that are not a part of the WPCP If you are not a part of the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program this year, but meet the income requirements, please apply for the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program starting February 1st. If your child is currently in 1st grade or higher, and you are currently not enrolled in the WPCP, then you can no longer apply for the program even if you meet the income requirements.
- 7. Requirements for new students to St. Joseph School From DPI Website

Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP): The student must reside in Wisconsin and outside the city of Milwaukee and Racine Unified School District. Continuing students and students on a WPCP prior year waiting list are not required to meet income limits.

The **new** student must also: (current families do not need to meet these requirements as they are already in the program)

- (1) be applying to grades K4, K5, 1 or 9, OR
- (2) meet one of the following prior year attendance requirements:
 - (a) attended a public school in Wisconsin,
 - (b) attended school in another state,
 - (c) was not enrolled in school (includes homeschooled students for the entire prior school year),
 - (d) participated in the MPCP, RPCP or WPCP,
 - (e) been on a MPCP, RPCP or WPCP waiting list, OR
- (3) applying to the WPCP and on any prior year WPCP waiting list in 2015-16 or later due to a school district enrollment cap.



2024-25 Income Limits for New Students Milwaukee (MPCP), Racine (RPCP) and Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP)

For the 2024-25 school year, the family income of a student new to a choice program must be at or below the amount listed in the table below for the program the student is applying. All students must apply each year at dpi.wi.gov/choice. If a student is continuing in any of the choice programs or was on the choice waiting list for the same Choice program in the prior year, he or she does not need to meet the income limits. Family income includes the income of the student's parent(s)/legal guardian(s) that reside in the same household as the student applicant. If the student's parents/legal guardians that reside in the same household are married, their income is reduced by \$7,000 when determining income eligibility for the program (i.e. married family income minus \$7,000). For example, if a family of four with parents that are married has an income of \$60,000, subtract \$7,000 from their income and compare that amount (\$53,000) to the income limit for a family of four in the appropriate table below. Family size includes parents/legal guardians and their children by birth, marriage or adoption that reside in the same household as the student applicant.

A private school may, in addition to the state aid payment it receives, charge a choice student tuition in an amount determined by the school if both of the following apply: (a) the student is in grades 9 through 12; and (b) the family income of the student exceeds 220% of the federal poverty level as listed below. The private school makes the determination whether the school can charge a choice student tuition in grades 9 through 12. The private school must establish a process for accepting appeals to the school's governing body related to the school's determination to charge a choice student tuition based on the student's family income.
