We are a worshiping community in the liturgy of the Eucharist. We share in God's desire for the salvation of all and He has given us the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in which we listen to His Word and receive Him Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Eucharist. God wants us to worship Him once a week at our weekend Masses for the salvation of the world. Please join us for our 5:00 PM Saturday evening Mass or on Sunday morning at the 8:30 AM or 10:30 AM Masses, and a 1:30 PM Mass in Spanish.

Also, we have a wonderful Catholic school. We take pride in our school as it has been voted the "Best Private School" in Elk River for the last 7 years in a row. But we are blessed most of all, in that, besides the great teaching of reading, writing, and arithmetic, we can talk about and learn about the Savior of the world, Jesus Christ.
