Our church patron, St. Andrew—whose feast day we celebrate November 30—was **the first of Christ's disciples to be called**. He responded by dropping his nets to lead others to Jesus (Matthew 4:18-20). We are called to emulate this example in our response **to God's abundant blessings**.

Our Vision

Building the Kingdom of God here and now through the witnessing of a lived faith

Our Mission

We, as a Catholic faith community, cast wide our net in welcoming all people as Christ. In a spirit of generosity, we utilize our time, talent and treasure to educate and serve one another.

We are building the Kingdom of God here and now:

- **By sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ's life, death and resurrection**
- By community outreach and service incorporating the corporal and spiritual works of mercy
- Because nothing is more important: every soul matters to God, and He longs for each of us to be with Him and grow deeper in loving communion

We are witnesses of a lived faith:

- Anchored in faith in Jesus Christ and His holy Church through prayer and the sacraments, especially the Eucharist
- By witnessing, because the most powerful tools we have for drawing people to Jesus are our example and our willingness to share our faith
- Led by the Spirit into an ever deeper relationship with Jesus so that our very lives draw people to Christ and His Church

We cast a wide net in service to God and neighbor:

- Recognizing our local faith community is part of a diverse, global Church
- Striving to see Jesus in everyone we meet and to be Jesus to them every day
- Not just participants, but partners with Christ – deepening our own faith and actively connecting others to the love of God in response to His continuous call to conversion

Our parish goal is that every member of our parish would not only recognize their call but be an authentic disciples of Jesus giving witness of a lived faith and build the Kingdom of God here and now by their actions, and that, as authentic disciples of Jesus, we would bring others to our community of disciples for the salvation of souls.

Stewardship then in this context is the grateful response of a Christian heart to all the gifts and graces received from God. As disciples of Jesus, we build the Kingdom of God by sharing our gifts of time, talent, and treasure with those around us. This is not simply a nice thing to do, but essential for the salvation of our souls.

And the king will say to them in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.’... He will answer them, ‘Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.’—Matthew 25:40, 45

Stewardship is an act of faith that recognizes God’s abundant gifts to us, trusts in God’s love and responds by returning those gifts in every facet of life. Stewardship also builds community. Parish Leadership

Finance Council: Advises the pastor and provides expertise on the overall financial operation of the parish. Experience in business, finance or accounting desirable. Meetings are held on the third Thursday of every other month, 5:00-6:00 PM. or as scheduled.

Pastoral Council: Advises the pastor, and listens to the parish community and recommends broad priorities, goals and policies to further the mission of the parish. Meetings are held on the third Thursday of every other month, 6:15-7:15 PM. or as scheduled.

School Advisory Board: Advises the school principal and pastor and provides recommendations to improve the quality and operation of our parish school. Meets the first Thursday of every other month, 6:00-8:00 PM.

Altar Server: Altar servers in grades 4 through 9 assist the priest during Mass and are scheduled once every one or two months. Adults are also welcome to join. It involves helping the sacristan with setting up the sanctuary before Mass, cleaning up afterward and assisting the priest during Mass. Training is required.

Holy Communion—Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister: Eucharistic ministers distribute the Body and Blood of Christ during weekend Masses and other weekday and evening masses. This ministry is open to all confirmed and practicing Catholics in good standing.

Greeter: Greeters are men, women and families who are outgoing and enjoy welcoming parishioners and visitors to Mass. Groups serving in the parish are also encouraged to take part in this ministry.



Lector: Lectors proclaim the Word of God (First and Second Readings) and Prayers of the Faithful (general intercessions). This ministry is open to all confirmed and practicing Catholics. Lectors are scheduled on a weekly basis, and books are provided for home study. Training is required.

Usher: Ushers are men, women and confirmed youth who help provide a welcoming atmosphere for those who attend Mass at Saint Andrew Catholic Church. They assist in seating, taking up collections, guiding the communion process, distributing bulletins and emergency assistance.

Art and Environment Committee: Members develop and display the seasonal decorations for the Church and meet seasonally to decorate.

Green Plant and Flower Committee: Members care for and water all of the green plants and flowers in the Church and Gathering Area.

Linen Care: Volunteers launder and iron all of the linens used for our liturgical celebrations, providing cleaning and ironing supplies as necessary. Linens are picked up in the sacristy on Monday and returned by the following Saturday.

Adult Choir: Open to anyone college-age or older, this choir sings three times per month and rehearses on Thursday evenings at 7:00 PM.

Men's Choir: Open to all men of the parish, this choir sings once a month and rehearses two Thursdays per month.

Women's Choir: Open to all women of the parish, this choir sings once a month and rehearses two Thursdays per month.

Christmas Choir/Triduum Choir: This ministry is open to anyone college-age and older who are interested in participating in choir, but has limited availability. There are approximately six to eight weeks of rehearsals.

Youth Choir: Open to all youth of the parish in grades 6-12, rehearses Wednesdays from 5:30 to 6:20 PM during the academic year.

Children's Choir: Open to all children of the parish in grades 2-5, rehearses on Wednesdays from 4:00 to 4:45 PM during the academic year.

Small Groups: This ministry is open to teens and adults who are interested in **singing at the "non-choir" Masses throughout the year.**

Multi-Generational Choir: This ministry is new in 2019! Adults, teens and children will join together to lead the music.

Funeral Choir: Open to all parishioners who would like to support families experiencing the loss of a loved one. Rehearsals are one hour before the funeral.

Hispanic Musicians and Choir: This group leads the music at the 1:00 PM Sunday Mass (in Spanish). Rehearsal is 45 minutes before Mass.

Latin Schola: This group leads chants at the First Saturday Masses.

Instrumentalists: We enjoy having additional instruments accompany the choirs and small groups—flute, clarinet, guitar, violin, percussion, etc.

Sound Technicians: Volunteers balance the electronic sound system in the church during the weekend Masses. This ministry is open to any member post-college age and involves arriving 20 minutes before Mass begins to set up microphones and turn them on and off during Mass.

Grades 1-5 Catechists and Helpers: Our elementary Faith Formation program meets roughly every other Wednesday from mid-September through mid-May. We need lead teachers for each grade to teach one 20- to 30- minute stations each night, plus plenty of adult and teen support to help students at each station.

Grades 6-11 Catechists and Small-Group Leaders: Our middle- and high-school Faith Formation programs meet roughly every other Wednesday from mid-September through mid-May. We need large-group catechists to lead prayer, group activities and the overarching lesson for each class, as well as small-group discussion leaders to build relationships between the teens and Jesus Christ.

Youth Core Team: We need committed high-school and adult disciples to help organize and put on youth events for middle- and high-school teens in our parish and community. Youth Core Team members will meet for prayer and formation once a month, plus help with a middle-school and/or high-school event each month.

Parish nurses collaborate with the priests, deacon(s), parish staff, and committees of the church as well as with a wide array of professional disciplines.

Parish nursing considers the spiritual, physical, psychological, and social aspects of individuals, families, and communities to create a sense of harmony with self, others, the environment, and our Faith. Parish nursing may provide support whenever people experience health challenges and seek support from their faith community in all stages of life and its many transitions from adjustments at birth through midlife to end of life.

Parish nursing is active in homes, rehab facilities, care communities and hospitals, interacting with staff, lay leaders, the congregation and the greater community to strengthen their capacity to understand and care for one another as part of their faith tradition.
