Join us for this wonderful opportunity to be trained in many areas. This retreat will equip you to become a greater Catechist, to work with youth or enhance your role as a small group leader.

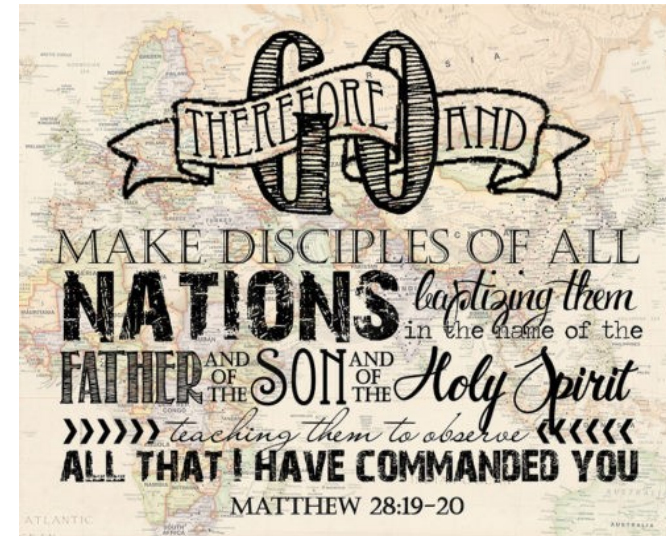
