COMMUNICATIONS AND STEWARDSHIP

CARD MINISTRY

This ministry sends out cards for various Holidays throughout the year. Parish members and staff receive cards during times of illness, death, high milestone anniversaries, and special congratulations. Volunteers write short messages in approximately 10 to 15 cards. Most supplies are provided. Volunteer time commitment includes one hour training and various times throughout the year to reignite the joy of writing and sending cards.

COFFEE AND DONUTS

This group, also called Hospitality Ministry, was formed over 20 years ago at Saint Henry's to promote fellowship after the Sunday Morning Masses. Parishioners gather in the Social Hall for coffee, orange juice and sweet rolls. There is a free will offering for the continental breakfast. Parishioners will volunteer to serve after either the 8:30 or 10:30 Masses. A schedule is mailed to these volunteers ahead of their serving date and a phone call reminder to serve is done by the coordinator. Servers help out once every 3-4 months and are placed with an experienced server. One can serve as a single, couple or family.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS

This process, known as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults and Children, provides formation for those seeking membership in the Catholic Faith. The adult process includes several weeks of inquiry during which an overview of the Catholic faith is presented. The next period is known as the Catechumenate, a time when candidates reflect on the Sunday Scripture readings. Sponsors join them following Mass during which there is a sharing on the impact the Scriptures have on their lives. As Lent and Easter nears there are other phases of the process. Children and youth ages 7-14 participate in the faith formation program as well as sessions focused on the Sacraments of Initiation. The OCIA seeks to nurture and celebrate the Catholic faith with all who long for a deeper relationship with Christ.

They wear a badge to signify to people that they can answer any questions that they might have. They are available to be of service to anyone needing help or directions. Cursillo

Cursillo begins with a three-day weekend that helps you experience your Catholic faith and encourages a spiritual life that is filled with joy, laughter, and enthusiasm. It provides a two-part method to help sustain and nurture you. 1) Group Reunions are informal gathering of three to five people who meet regularly (once a week) to share their faith and support each other in their spiritual life. 2) Ultreyas are monthly gatherings or Group Reunions.

To attend a Cursillo weekend you must have a sponsor who has been an active Cursillo member for at least one year. A sponsor is responsible for preparing you for the weekend, establishing you in a Group Reunion where you live or work, and introducing you to an Ultreya in your area. Separate weekends are held for men and women. If you are married, both spouses should be willing to participate. You will receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. They are an integral part of the Catholic Cursillo.

Faith Formation Pre-school – 6th Grade:

The programs we offer to form the children in the knowledge of the Catholic Faith depends on the generosity of many volunteers to give of their gifts, especially those with the gift of teaching. The main form of volunteers for this ministry are Catechists who are dedicated to a holiness of life through the Sacraments and sharing the life of faith with others. Ideally, there are two teachers in each classroom, creating unity, flexibility for the volunteers, collaboration with lesson plans, ability to bounce teaching and ideas off of one another, and is safer for the students and the volunteers. We also need hall monitors during the 3:55pm and 6:00pm Wednesday class times. In addition to Wednesday classes we also need adult volunteers to help with learning stations at the First Reconciliation and First Communion retreats as well as during Faith Filled Family nights. These are nights that parents and teens will hear a dynamic speaker while the children are engaged in learning activities. Volunteer adults are needed to facilitate and monitor the activities and students.

Our Faith Formation program is designed to support parents, the primary educators of their children, by offering Faith Formation Classes for children (PreK-8th) and Discipleship Groups for teens (9th-12th) to help teach students about Christ and His Church. Programs don't make disciples, only disciples make disciples. If you are someone who loves Jesus, faithfully attends Sunday Mass, believes, and accepts all of the Church's teachings, and desires to share this treasure with other, consider and pray about serving as a Catechist or Discipleship-Group Mentor. For 1st-8th grade youth, we coordinate weekly Faith Formation classes to teach the rich truths of the Catholic Faith. Each class is led by two teen or adult co-catechists. For high-school youth, we coordinate Discipleship Groups, which are all-male or all-female small groups of 5-8 high-school youth led by 2 adult mentors, who commit to meeting regularly for all four years of high-school to grow in faith & life together through study, sharing and discussion, prayer, and service. Each group is led by two adult Discipleship-Group leaders (male or female for the respective groups).
