

Friday was the last day of school, with an all-school Mass. It is fitting that at Eucharist, which means thanksgiving, we recalled so many blessings of the academic year, and offered thanks to God, through Christ. 30 of our eighth graders, now graduates, join the ranks of our proud alumni. See all the pictures on the school and parish's Facebook pages. PSR has completed another year, and I was in PSR classes for their last class this past Monday. Many blessings have been poured over all our students this year, and next year looks bright. Our school enrollment is solid, and looks to be growing. The faculty and administration is top notch.

This week you will see a dumpster outside the school for the demolition of the chimney. This is the first step in replacing the 1987 school roof. The grounds around are campus are looking good thanks to the volunteers in the Garden Club. A number of them worked on some of the edging around the landscaping. A parishioner donates the spraying of the lawn. New flags flying in front of the church are a gift from a parishioner. Thanks! Their generous stewardship benefits all of us. With summer comes many parishioners being away from weekend Mass due to vacations. The mission of the parish continues, bills and salaries must be met, so your regular contributions are critical. A great way to contribute and perhaps a more convenient way, is to set up a recurring gift online via the website (http:// www.ctkparish.com/online-giving). It is easy, safe, and provides the parish the needed cash flow each week, even if you are away. Thanks for your continued stewardship.

Just as we care about the campus of the church and school, so I care about the safety of our children in school, and all of you in church during Mass. We have been locking the church doors during school Masses for some time now. The small measure of locking the church

doors once weekend Masses begin is with this in mind: your safety. You can still exit all the church doors at any time. Last weekend I saw ushers stationed at the center doors greet and let in late-comers. That is a gesture of hospitality; and think of hospitality as providing a safe place for all to worship. It is not iron clad; it makes us less of a soft target. I wish we did not live in these times of shootings in churches, synagogues and mosques. None of those places of worship thought it would happen to them. So our measures are about being smart.

The new assignments for priests and transitional deacons are out. See the Catholic Times for the full list. There is no change for Christ the King, which is not surprising since there are no newly ordained this month, and one active pastor, Father Bunse died last February, and another priest retired. So assisting with my workload, Madonna Jones has led funeral vigil prayers and committal prayers at the cemetery. We have a large and active volunteer Parish Nurse Ministry. Our lay led bible studies and adult formation draw not just parishioners, but others outside our parish. A large group of trained parishioners are in the ministry of taking Holy Communion to the homebound on Sundays and weekdays. In short, CTK is the parish where lay people step up as leaders and ministers in extraordinary ways. There is no clericalism here. Ministry is not dependent on the clergy, not because I can't do it all, but because by your baptism, you are called to be disciples, to minister to others. For that I am grateful, and it gives me great joy to lead this parish of dynamic Catholics. Tuesday is my 31st anniversary of ordination, and thanks to you I have many blessings to count.




