Pastor's Pen



I am away these days on my snowboard in Colorado. God is good! Back in the office on Friday.

During the Listening Campaign, someone asked why we don't pray the St. Michael Prayer at the end of Mass. There is no better prayer the Church prays, no more holier encounter with our God, no better way to grow strong in the faith, than in the liturgy of the Eucharist. It is "the source and summit of the Christian life" Lumen Gentium, 11. The Eucharist is described as the summit, the apex, the pinnacle of the Christian life because it contains "the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely, Christ himself, our Pasch" Catechism of the Catholic Church 1324. So when we leave Mass, we are fortified with and by Christ to be his faithful disciples, to be strong against the devil. There is no need to beseech St. Michael the Archangel at the end of Mass. The better time to pray to St. Michael to defend you in battle is when you feel weak and tempted to sin. I encourage you, since you know the prayer by heart, to say it daily, perhaps as part of your morning prayers, or perhaps multiple times during the day when you feel tempted to sin.

Another great prayer, which is part of the Mass, is the Lord's Prayer. When the devil is trying to trip you up, pray it hard, like you mean it. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil are powerful words the devil doesn't want us to utter. A powerful sacramental to ward off the devil is holy water. When you leave Mass to go out into the world, you dip your hand in the holy water font at the door and make the sign of the cross, the mark of who you belong to. Set up a holy water font at home as that spiritual renewal and armor in the face of temptation. You can see now that by the end of Mass, we have the best of everything in that moment to be saints for God.

It is good to grow in your appreciation of the

richness and history of the Mass. It disturbs me greatly when parishioners join a non-Catholic Church. They walk away from the Eucharist, as if unaware that the Mass is a piece of heaven on earth. We encounter Jesus Christ who gives us life. "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, you have no life in you." (John 6:53) That is why the program *The Mass* is being offered on six Sunday evenings in Lent. Our other adult formation and bible studies are daytime sessions, so I am pleased this is an evening class. This concern was raised in the Listening Campaign. Please sign up in the vestibule, or online.

You are seeing new altar servers at the weekend Masses. These fourth graders have answered the call to be good stewards of their time and talent. You see the list in this bulletin. Thanks to the parents who have brought them to their training sessions, and who see to it that their children are here for their appointed Masses. And thanks to Mike Rogers who conducts the training for our new servers. Mike also trains and schedules the adult servers for weekday Masses. Some of our servers "retire" after 8th grade, and others stay on into high school. I am grateful to all for their service at the Lord's altar.

The planning committee for our annual school auction and casino night has been hard at it, leading up to this Saturday, Feb. 22. There is still time to get a ticket. 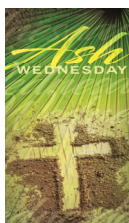

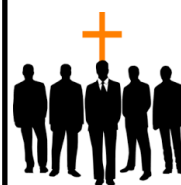

RCIA Dismissal for Breaking Open the Word



The RCIA will dismiss our unbaptized catechumens beginning February 23 at the 5:00 p.m. Sunday evening Mass. At the dismissal, they will further discuss the Word Of God and the homily. The purpose of dismissal is to help them grow in love and knowledge of God through the scriptures. Dismissal is not a time for catechesis. It is a time for reflection, prayer, and faith-sharing that flow from God's Word. This Rite will continue each Sunday until the Easter Vigil. Those being dismissed are in a period of intense formation and training as they continue on their spiritual journey that will include the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

In 2019, CTK was extremely generous to the Habitat for Humanity program and members of our Parish were also very involved in the building of a house for a deserving family.

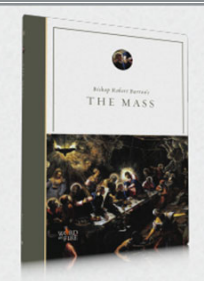
