## NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC RENEWAL

#### 1ST INVITATION: REINVIGORATING WORSHIP

Are you wondering why there has been a few little additions in the celebration of the Mass at St. John's? The USCCB (The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) have invited each parish to participate in the National Eucharistic Renewal, which is a momentous, three-year initiative. We are now in the 2nd year, the Year of the Parish Renewal (June 2023 - July 2024). It is hoped that parishes will experience profound renewal while participating in this grassroots efforts inspired by the four invitations of the Renewal for this year.

Beginning with the source and summit of the Church's life and mission, the first invitation is "reinvigorating worship" with a special attentiveness to the art of celebration in the liturgy. This is celebrating the liturgy beautifully, with faithful attention to making the Light of Christ shine more brightly in our celebration of the Mass and help us encounter Jesus in a personal way and as a parish community.

So, if you notice a slight addition in the celebration of the Mass, it is to help us draw closer to Christ and orient our minds and hearts to the beauty that is taking place at the Mass. For example, the singing of the hymn Sanctuary as Fr. Remi is distributing the Eucharist to the ministers and servers. The purpose of this is to help prepare us to receive the Eucharist, the true body and blood of Jesus Christ.



#### Why Ring the Bells?

You've probably noticed that bells are being rung during Mass. The Roman Catholic Church has a long history of ringing bells on the Altar to draw attention during the

Consecration of the Holy Eucharist. Since the time of the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), the Mass has been offered in the language of the people (vernacular), rather than in traditional Latin. Thus, bell ringing was determined to be optional, since everyone in the parish congregation can understand and follow what is being prayed on the Altar. Fr Remi and other St John's parish leaders have decided to bring back the ringing of the Altar bells during the Liturgy of the Eucharist, especially during this year of "Eucharistic Renewal" for all Catholics. In drawing attention during the Consecration - at the Epiclesis, the elevation of the Host, and the elevation of the Chalice – it is hoped that our parish family will be drawn ever closer into the wonderful gift and reality that our Lord Jesus Christ has given His real body and blood to us in the Eucharist.
