Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Here we are at the beginning of a new year! I once again wish you all a very happy one full of blessings and grace. Goodness knows that we have had our share of challenges last year, and I am sure that this year will bring us different ones. However, as St. Paul assures us, Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Whatever comes, His grace will also be there in the midst of it all!

I wanted to once again invite all of us to ponder (if we have not already done so) the spiritual possibilities that we could undertake to make this year an even more gracefilled time. Christ offers us limitless riches in the ways of the Spirit. We should take every advantage that we have as Catholic Christians. I mentioned last weekend in my homily that the Epiphany story from Matthew speaks of three individuals or groups of people: Herod, the religious experts (chief priests and the scribes), and the Magi. Herod was only concerned with power and worldly things, and had neither the heart for nor the knowledge of the Lord. The chief priests and the scribes had all the head knowledge that the Lord had revealed to them through the Law and the Prophets, but did not have even enough love in their hearts to go five miles to look for the Lord. It was only the Magi who had the heart to seek the knowledge of how to find Him, and went to the effort to actually seek Him out. Only they actually found Him, and when they did, worshiped Him.

I wish to once again exhort us all to be like them! Though they had far more disadvantages than we do in terms of revelation, they sought Him with all their hearts, put in the effort and considerable time, and were thusly rewarded. We can do the same if we seek Him by seeking to know Him and His truth better, and come to him in prayer and adoration. Quite simply, if we are not seeking to learn more about our Faith every day, as well as seeking to develop our relationship with Him in prayer and contemplation, we run the risk of falling into the company of Herod and those scribes all those years ago. We will not find Him who is the fulfillment of all our heart's desire.

Especially, take time to foster your own prayer and devotional life. Take the time to sign up for, and be faithful to, an hour of adoration in our St. Clare Chapel. Though it might not be fireworks and a parting of clouds and a booming voice, I can promise that it will move you in profound ways, seen and unseen, if you simply seek Him out.
