Recently I was blessed to have the opportunity to attend the St. John Bosco Conference at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio. This was a week packed full of presentations, training, and inspiration that were incredibly helpful and relevant to the ministries offered in a parish. Two of the major themes highlighting the conference were prayer and encounter. One presenter in particular spoke about prayer and why it must be our foundation not just for ministry but also for family life, work life, and personal and social life. It is necessary that prayer is the foundation of all we do. When God is left out of the conversation or becomes an afterthought it makes it difficult to offer all we do to Him only consulting Him when the planning has been finished. Then we ask for his guidance because usually, something does not go according to our plan. This leaves little room for a fruitful relationship with Christ. He should always and forever be placed first before we start the project, conversation, class, daily chores, or even just when we want to consult someone for advice or guidance. I know this probably seems like common knowledge, but for me, it was very eye opening and reflective to see if I had been doing this and I could wholeheartedly answer, "No!" This was very humbling and made me rethink many things. One is the power of prayer and bringing that back into the spotlight in our parish. One way we will do this is through Eucharistic Adoration in the church during our religious ed. classes so that parents can have time to pray and offer their children and families in prayer. We will be implementing more ways to encounter our Lord throughout the year.

The next focus will be encounter, which should always be a focus in our personal and social lives. We will focus on whether we have encountered the person of Christ and whether that has caused a conversion in our lives. The second part is when we model ourselves after Christ and conform ourselves so that when people encounter us they know we are one of His disciples and one of His beloved children. Having an encounter with Christ is not an once-in-a-lifetime thing. It is a constant and neverending goal. When asked the question in class, "Do you constantly strive to encounter Christ?" my answer was, "Yes... but sometimes I feel like He runs when I pursue Him". Sure enough, as this came into my head during the class, the professor addressed this very thing. He said, "Sometimes when we are struggling to encounter Christ, and He seems to move away from us, take a step back and see who really moved, or are we just setting boundaries for how we want to encounter Him and not letting Him lead the encounter?" This was thought provoking and started a discussion amongst parish leaders from all over the US about how we hear people of all ages and congregations struggling with this and that we were struggling with this as well. The professor's advice was to stop trying to perfect the encounter...that's God's job, not yours. Offer as many opportunities for others to encounter Christ as possible, including when people interact with you. We will do this through encouraging the sacraments creating time for adoration and learning to pray to God and how to invite Him into our everyday lives. He wants to be there. He loves the mess and the chaos of family life because He loves being a part of our families. We will also talk about this a lot with the kids throughout the school year because no matter the age, you are never too young to encounter God.

We will still have our Faith Formations this year, and we hope and encourage everyone to attend these along with the Religious Ed. classes and Youth Group. These are great ways to encounter Christ and grow in your faith life. They offer opportunities to grow as a community, to get out of our comfort zone, and have more meaningful and fruitful encounters with others.
