Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

This past Thursday, the 14th of September, we celebrated the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the liturgical calendar. This celebration began with the discovery of the True Cross in a cave downhill from Calvary in Jerusalem by St. Helena in the 300s. However, in the early 600s, the Persians attacked Jerusalem and the Holy Sepulcher church, which housed the relic as well as the tomb of Jesus and Calvary, was destroyed. In the aftermath, the cross was taken by the Persians as a war trophy. Fortunately, only a few years later the Byzantine emperor Heraclius defeated the Persians in open war and demanded the Cross returned. The Persian king complied and the Cross was restored to Jerusalem, resulting in the celebration of the Holy Cross being conducted throughout the Christian world from that time forward.

The Cross. What began as the most heinous and shameful and painful instruments of Roman torture and execution became the most recognizable sign of hope for the world. The Cross and the Crucifixion revealed one of the most important realities of our Faith: that God is willing to go to any lengths and depths to save and redeem us from sin and death, even to suffer as one of us. What we celebrate in this feast of the Holy Cross is not merely the suffering and pain that it historically signified, but even more so the redemption that suffering wrought. Christ died, but He rose and He ascended to the Father. The greatest tragedy in the history of the world because the greatest victory that makes the depths of hell quake in fear.

This is not just some pious, high-minded idea that has no bearing on our individual lives. Jesus Himself told us to take up our own cross daily and follow Him. Therefore, the miracle of the Cross translates into our own individual lives. We need not despair of what suffering with Jesus will bring us. It will bring us suffering, pain, and uncertainty, yes, because it brought those things to Him as well. However, it will also bring us victory and redemption. All things that are evil and tragic can be redeemed if suffered patiently and with faith and hope and love in Jesus. There is no corruption and destruction in creation that cannot be touched and transformed by the logic of the Cross. When we suffer, especially innocently, and we offer it up to the Father, we redeem with Christ. We can have confidence that God who takes the darkest hour of history and makes it the most glorious can do so with us as well.

We adore You, O Christ, and we praise You, because by Your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world.


