Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I once again would like to dip into the Ask Father box to address a good question that was recently asked. I'll take my best shot!

"When we offer Masses for the dead, the Holy Souls in Purgatory, is this specifically an action to help get them into heaven, or are the Holy Souls in Purgatory actually present at the Mass along with the angels and saints of heaven? Are they aware of our prayers and intentions for them?"

Great question! First of all, prayer for the dead is Scriptural, as we see in Second Maccabees that prayer and sacrifice is offered in the Temple for the slain who had committed the sin of a minor idolatry. If the greatest prayer that we have in our spiritual treasure chest is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and the entire goal of prayer, discipleship, and religion is perfect (re)union with the God who made us (which is heaven), then of course we offer the Mass to get souls from purgatory to heaven.

This does not however imply that the souls in purgatory are somehow excluded from the Mass. As part of the Church Suffering, they are still part of the Church, and it is the *whole* Church that participates in the worship of God in the Mass. It isn't just the Church Militant (we here on earth) and the Church Triumphant (the angels and saints).

To answer the last portion of the question, yes the souls who are undergoing their purification are indeed aware of the prayers for them. Those in purgatory have passed the threshold of death. This means that the time to decide and act virtuously or sinfully is also past. They can no longer atone for their sins on their own, but we believe that they now depend on our prayers for them, as we are still able to offer atonement for them. It may be a trite example, but if you were sitting in a wheelchair and someone came up behind you and started pushing you forward, would you not notice that you were moving? Our prayers really do assist these souls through their purification and toward their union with God. This the Church enthusiastically affirms (CCC 1032).

House of Discernment Winter Update

The spring semester is underway for college students across our diocese. Likewise, the formation and discernment for the 3 residents at the Father Deydier House of Discernment has begun. Craig Wilmes, Holy Redeemer, Michael Mosbey, Good Shepherd, and Chase Riecker, St. Isidore are each moving forward in their prayer and decision-making as they seek to hear and follow the voice of Jesus Christ in their lives.

On Dec. 22, about 20 young men gathered at the House for "Man Christmas". Dinner and games preceded a white-elephant style gift-exchange of protein bars, razors, tools and other things guys enjoy. The evening concluded with prayer in the House Chapel. Over Christmas break, many of the seminarians of the Diocese of Evansville stayed at the House to pray, study and to be together.

The monthly "Savio Night" gathering of faith formation for teenage guys has grown so large that the group has now been split into two. 6th & 7th grade boys kept the title "Savio" & gather at the House before prayer & faith formation at Sacred Heart Church, & the older group, now called "Giorgio" after Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, joins for the overlapping prayer and faith formation time. Then, the older group gathers at the House as the younger group departs. 88 young men from 18 parishes have attended this school year.

Monday Night "Holy Hour & Mass for Vocations" continues to grow. A Christmas gathering co-sponsored by Annunciation's "Made for More" young adult ministry brought more than 300 men, women & children to pray in the presence of the Lord on Dec. 30.

Diocesan Policy: Report and Inform

The Diocese of Evansville has in place a policy that requires that any allegation of child abuse must be reported to civil authorities. If an allegation involves the sexual abuse of a minor by diocesan personnel, the Victim Assistance Coordinator must also be informed. Sexual misconduct violates human dignity and the mission of the church. The spiritual well-being of all victims, their families, and others in the community is of particular concern to the church.

Report child abuse

Every allegation of child abuse must be reported to Child Protection Services, an agency of Indiana state government. CPS Toll-free: 800-800-5556. Local law enforcement: 9-1-1.

Report and inform

In the event of an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor (a person under 18) by diocesan personnel, report the allegation to authorities, and inform the Victim Assistance Coordinator for the diocese: Toll-free: 866-200-3004, Local: 812-490-9565.
