

FR. ANTONIO'S CORNER

A Reflection for Palm Sunday



“Reflections in front of the One Crucified”

Arrested by the security forces of the Temple, Jesus no longer has any doubt: The Father does not seem to have heard his desire to continue living; His disciples flee away looking for their own safety. He is alone. His project to establish the Kingdom of God fade. Execution awaits him. Jesus is in crisis.

The silence of Jesus during his last hours is overwhelming. However, the evangelists have collected some of his words on the cross. These are very short, but they helped the first Christian

generations to remember with love and gratitude Jesus being crucified.

Luke gathered a few words which Jesus utters while being crucified. Among shudders and

cries of pain, Jesus manages to say a few words, which show what was in his heart: **“Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.”**

So is Jesus.

He is asking his disciples to “love your enemies” and “pray for those who persecute you.” And now it is he himself who dies forgiving. He turns his crucifixion into forgiveness. This request to the Father for those who are crucifying him is, above all, a sublime gesture of compassion and trust in the unfathomable forgiveness of God. This is the great legacy of Jesus to humanity: Do not ever doubt God. His mercy is endless.

Mark picks up another dramatic cry of the crucified: **“My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me!?”** These words uttered in the midst of total loneliness and abandonment, are of overwhelming sincerity. Jesus feels his beloved Father has abandoned him. Why? **Jesus complains about the Father’s silence.**

Where is He? Why does He keep silent? **Jesus’** cry of anguish, identified with that of all the victims in history, asking God for an explanation to such injustice, neglect and suffering, is now on the lips of the Crucified One who demands an answer from God beyond death: O God my God, why have you

abandoned me? Are You not going to ever respond to the cries and moans of the innocent?

Luke records **Jesus’ last word.** Despite his mortal anguish, Jesus maintained until

the end his trust and confidence in the Father. **His words are now almost a whisper: “Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.”** Nothing and no one have been able to separate him from his Father. The Father has been animating with his Spirit all the life and activity of Jesus. Having completed his mission, Jesus leaves everything in the hands of the Father. The Father will break his silence and will rise him.

During this Holy Week we need to enter the real experience of the passion and death of Jesus, and through Him, experience empathy with the passion and death of so many victims. Father, into your hands we commend all our worries.





HOLY THURSDAY COLLECTION: At the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 18th, the collection is dedicated to the support of the charitable works of St. John's Cathedral—St. John's Food Bank, the St. John Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, and the St. John's Christian Aid Fund. Your generous support of these ministries of the Cathedral is graciously requested.

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION: At the Stations of the Cross and at the Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday, April 19th, a collection will be taken up to support the Church of the Holy Land. The collected funds will go to the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem (The Latin Roman Catholic Diocese of Holy Land embracing Israel, Palestine, Jordan, and Cyprus). The Patriarchate will use the funds to support not only the shrines of the Holy Land, but also the parishes, schools and ministries of the Church. Your generous support of this collection is requested.

CHANGE OF POSTURE Following the decision of Bishop Peter Christensen, beginning the weekend of April 27th-28th (2nd Sunday of Easter) during Mass the faithful are to **KNEEL** upon the **completion** of the recitation or singing of the "Lamb of God" or Agnus Dei and remain kneeling until they stand for the communion procession. Those unable to kneel are to sit. With this decision Bishop Peter also stated, "The encouraged posture in receiving communion is to remain standing." With this change, all should keep in mind the instruction given in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal, #42*, "A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them."



Reflexiones ante el Crucificado



Arrestado por las fuerzas de seguridad del Templo, Jesús ya no tiene ninguna duda: el Padre no parece haber escuchado su deseo de seguir viviendo; Sus discípulos huyen buscando su propia seguridad. El está solo. Su proyecto sobre el establecimiento del Reino de Dios se desvanece. La ejecución le espera. Jesús está en crisis.

El silencio de Jesús durante sus últimas horas es abrumador. Sin embargo, los evangelistas han recogido algunas de sus palabras en la cruz. Son muy breves, pero ayudaron a las primeras generaciones cristianas a recordarlas con amor y gratitud a Jesús crucificado.

Lucas reunió algunas que Jesús pronunció en la cruz. Entre estremecimientos y gritos de dolor, Jesús logra decir algunas palabras que muestran lo que había en su corazón: "Padre, perdónalos porque no saben lo que hacen".

Así es Jesús.

Jesús está pidiendo a sus discípulos que "amen a sus enemigos" y "oren por aquellos

que los persiguen". Y ahora es él mismo quien muere perdonando. Convierte su crucifixión en perdón. Esta petición al Padre por quienes lo están crucificando es, ante todo, un gesto sublime de compasión y confianza en el perdón insondable de Dios. Este es el gran legado de Jesús a la humanidad: nunca dudes de Dios. Su misericordia es infinita.



Marcos capta otro dramático grito del crucificado: "Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué me has abandonado?". Estas palabras pronunciadas en medio de la soledad y el abandono total son de una sinceridad abrumadora. Jesús siente que su amado padre lo ha abandonado. ¿Por qué? Jesús se queja del silencio del Padre. ¿Dónde está el? ¿Por qué guarda silencio? El grito de angustia

de Jesús, identificado con el de todas las víctimas de la historia, pidiéndole a Dios una explicación por tanta injusticia, negligencia y sufrimiento, ahora está en los labios del Crucificado que exige una respuesta de Dios más allá de la muerte: Dios, ¿por qué me has abandonado? ¿No vas a responder de una vez a los gritos y lamentos de los inocentes?

Lucas registra la última palabra de Jesús. A pesar de su angustia mortal, Jesús mantuvo hasta el final su confianza en el Padre. Sus palabras son ahora casi un susurro: "Padre, en tus manos encomiendo mi espíritu". Nada ni nadie ha podido separarlo de su Padre. El Padre ha estado animando con su Espíritu toda la vida y actividad de Jesús. Completada su misión, Jesús deja todo en manos del Padre. El Padre romperá su silencio y lo levantará de la muerte el día de la resurrección.

Durante esta Semana Santa, tenemos que entrar en la experiencia real de la pasión y muerte de Jesús, ya través de Él, experimentar y empatizar con la pasión y muerte de tantas víctimas. Padre, en tus manos encomendamos todas nuestras preocupaciones.


