



Greetings from Poland!

I hope all of you are doing well. I have been thinking about you and praying for you as I visit the different churches in Poland.

I spent the last few days with my family at home, playing with my nephew, Stanislaus Jr. I will baptize him next Saturday.

Last Thursday I drove to the city of Zielona Gora and visited the co-Cathedral of St. Hedwig. It is the oldest architectural monument in the city, dating to the second half of the 14th century. The cathedral has a

triple-nave hall arrangement with a separate presbytery. Inside there are a neo-Gothic altar, late Gothic sculptures of Saint Hedwig and Saint Anna Samotrzec, a Baroque choir and a series of stone slabs with epitaphs. In the south nave, an illustration of the Sepulchre of Christ in Jerusalem is drawn on plaster. The neighboring parish house is the former Catholic school.

Then I went to see a little vineyard village of Winny Dworek. That small part of western Poland is known for its vineyards.

It is Sunday morning and I am ready to go to church—my home parish of St. Michael the Archangel. I pray for all of you.



FATIMA ROSARY On August 13th, the mayor of Ourem, a town ten miles away from Fatima, kidnapped the children, and put them in jail. They were imprisoned for two days with common criminals. He threatened to boil them in oil if they would not deny seeing Our Lady of Fatima. The mayor wanted to discredit the Fatima apparitions by getting the children to either deny seeing Our Lady or by revealing the Secret before its time. His objective was to destroy the credibility of the seers. Jacinta was first. The mayor had her carried off, first and boiled in oil until she died, unless she complied. Then Francisco then Lucia. Each of them separately was willing to die rather than to be unfaithful to Our Lady.



The children could not be persuaded. The people came anyway, eighteen to twenty thousand, and witnessed all the same external signs as in previous apparitions, without actually seeing Our Lady.

Once again we will be honoring Our Lady in obedience to her request to meet her at the same time each month, and offering her the Rosary she asks. **Please join with Legion of Mary on Tuesday Evening, August 13th, at 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel, in being faithful to her request.** We are grateful to Deacon Tom Dominick, who will offer the Benediction.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE — August 11, 2019, 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Tickets booked, packing list double-checked, itinerary set - how do you know you're prepared for a trip? Being ready requires plenty of practical preparation. Do we give the same care to our spiritual preparedness? "Your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom," Jesus tells us. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reminds us to have the right attitude for the gifts and callings he wants to give us!

Clear out your clutter! "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Jesus reminds the disciples that earthly standards of security and success will wear out in time. If our lives are structured around values that don't align with the kingdom of God, we'll miss opportunities to receive God. If we're so concerned with our child's success in sports that we miss Sunday Mass for their tournaments, we're missing out receiving the sacraments and building a consistent community of faith. If our quest for the promotion takes us away from family commitments, we won't be able to fully receive the love intended in our closest relationships.

Set faith-based priorities. "Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival." Our conflicting commitments can cause any routine to slip from time to time. All the more reason to make sure faith is a priority. Pray as a family before meals. Bring your children regularly to the sacrament of confession. Make room in the schedule for faith enrichment activities offered by your parish. Volunteer once a month. "At an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." When will the call come to care for an ailing parent? To take on a new leadership position? God speaks to us through the circumstances of our lives. He calls each of us to greater love, sometimes in very concrete ways. This week, take some time to consider: Will you be ready?




LIFELONG CONVERSION

LAST WEEK we featured some principles for living that are emphasized strongly in the Bible. This week we continue this “Station of Lifelong Conversion: Moral Foundation” with five more:

- **Be Generous with Time and Money.** Each of us has something to offer to someone in need. We can give our money and our time to charity, be a friend to someone who is sick or lonely, do volunteer work or choose a service-oriented occupation. We may give unselfishly of our time to our spouse, children or parents.
- **Practice what you Preach; Don’t be a Hypocrite.** If there was any one group of people that Jesus couldn't stand, it was hypocrites! The Pharisees of Jesus' time were a religious and political party that insisted on very strict observance of Biblical laws on tithing, ritual purity and other matters. At the same time, many of the Pharisees forgot the true spirit and intent of the law and became self-indulgent, self-righteous, snobbish, and greedy.
- **Don’t Be Self-righteous.** Living a moral life means taking responsibility for controlling our own behavior. If we say or even think we are better than people we consider to be "sinners," we are guilty of the sin of self-righteousness.
- **Don’t Hold a Grudge.** Jesus said there is no place for hatred, holding a grudge, revenge, retaliation or getting even in the life of a Christian. A grudge destroys the grudge-holder with bitterness, and revenge only escalates hostilities.
- **Forgive Others.** God is merciful and forgives our sins and failings. In the same way, we must be merciful and forgive other people who sin against us or do us harm.




