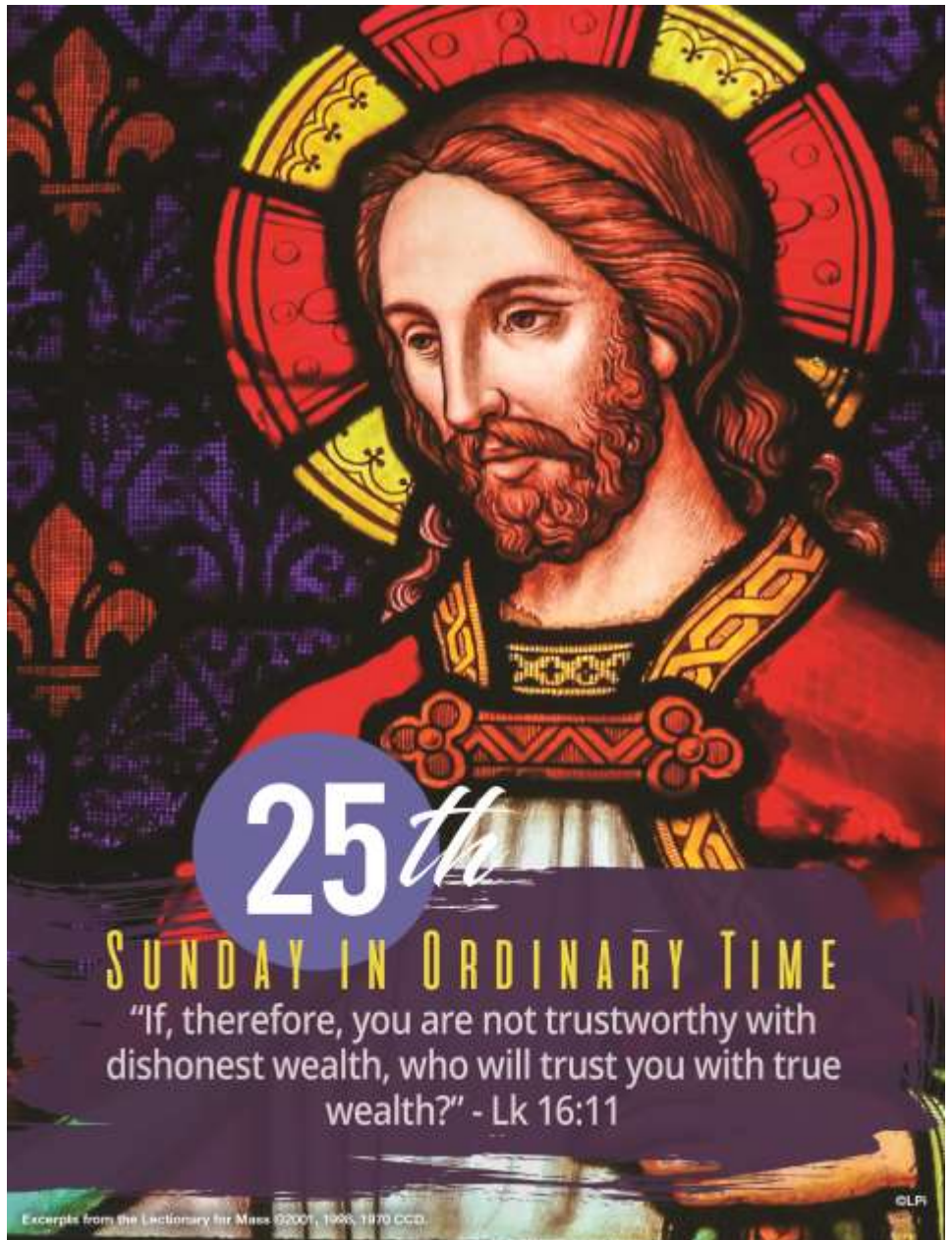

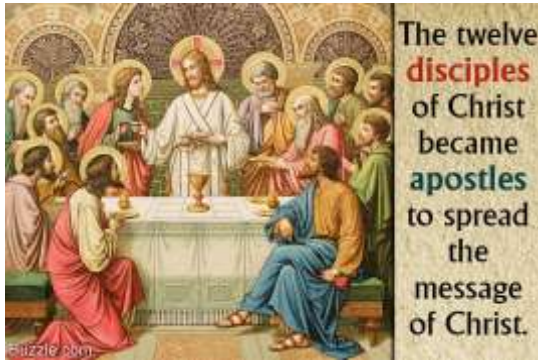

The Gospel of John stands apart from the other three “synoptic” gospels, for if Matthew’s primary audience was the Hebrews, Mark’s was written for the Romans, and Luke’s was designed to address the Greeks, then John’s narrative emerges far more expansive: about 90% of its material is not found in the other three gospels. There’s a reason his traditional symbol is the eagle because of soaring rhetoric. This session is primarily facilitated by Fr. Dominique. Bring your favorite Holy Bible to follow along!

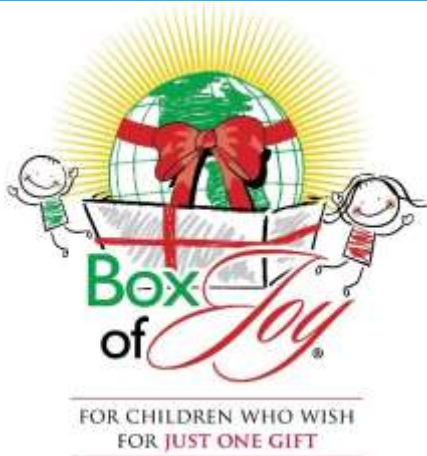

FIFTH GRADERS LEARN ABOUT IDAHO SALMON! Salmon and Steelhead Days is a three-day event, hosted by the Idaho Department of Fish and Game. It's a chance for 5th graders to come and learn about the salmon that are a part of Idaho's state heritage. Roughly 2,000 kids participate each year in activities led by the IDFG and community volunteers that are geared towards active, hands-on learning. Students are introduced to aquatic ecosystems at Kids in the Creek, where they donned boots and waded into the river as ecologists helped them identify different organisms and the components of healthy ecosystems. ARE YOU INTERESTED IN HELPING MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN THE LIVES OF INCOMING REFUGEES? There is a critical need at the International Rescue Committee (IRC) for a volunteer to lead in matching incoming refugee families with mentor volunteers from the Boise community. The mentor volunteers are individuals, couples or families who are passionate about helping the refugees successfully become thriving members in our community. The specific role of Friendship Partner Coordinator is as follows:

Major responsibilities: Help match volunteer families with newly arrived refugee families by gathering information on both the refugee and local volunteer families to facilitate a successful match. This includes facilitating initial meetings, providing ongoing support for the mentor relationship during the 6-month match and troubleshooting if issues arise. This person will provide regular updates to the IRC's database (training provided) reflecting matches, case-note updates covering the mentoring relationships and resettlement status of the refugee family. Finally, this role is active in recruiting and outreach for new Friendship Partners to the program in coordination with other IRC and community volunteers.

Time commitment: Minimum 8 hours per week, flexible hours

Skills Requirement: Computer literacy (proficient with Microsoft Office-mostly Word, Excel, Outlook), comfort in working across languages and cultures (will train on contracting with interpreters), good people and mediation skills (particularly empathetic, flexible, patience with a good sense of humor).
