FR. ANTONIO'S CORNER



A Reflection for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Your Ways are Not My Ways

On the road to Jerusalem, Jesus is warning his disciples of the painful fate that awaits him and those who follow on His footsteps. The unconsciousness of those accompanying him is incredible. Even today this inconsistency continues.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, separate themselves from the rest of the group and approach Jesus. They do not seem to need the rest of the group. They just wish to seize the most privileged positions of power and be the first ones in what they perceive was Jesus' project. Their request is not a humble request but a ridiculous ambition: "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." They want Jesus to place them above the rest of the disciples.

Jesus seems surprised. "You do not know what you are asking." They have not understood Jesus. With great patience, Jesus invites them to wonder if they are going to be able to share in his painful fate. They say yes, although they do not clearly get what Jesus really means.


When the other ten disciples find out what is going on, they become angry with James, and John. They too have the same aspirations. Ambition divides and confronts them. The quest for honors and to play protagonist roles always breaks and divides the communion of the Christian community. This is true also today. What could be more contrary to Jesus and His project to serve to the liberation of the people?

This event was so serious and disturbing that

Jesus "summoned them" to make it clear what should the attitude be that characterize His disciple. They already know how the Romans «the rulers of the people» and «lords» of the land behave: they tyrannize the people, submit them and make feel all the weight of their power over the people. Jesus urges them, that «none of this» should take place among them.

Among His followers, everything has to be different: «whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. Greatness is not measured by the power that one may possess, the degree one may carry or the titles one gained. The one who desires to possess these things, in the Church of Jesus, is not a great person but is the most insignificant and ridiculous one. In fact, titles and grandeur are a hindrance to the growth in the life style willed by the Crucified One. In the Church of Jesus, everyone must be a servant. Each one of us must place ourselves in the Christian community, not from above, from superiority, power or interested protagonism, but from below, from the availability, and service.

Jesus is our example. He never lived 'to be served, but to serve.' This is the best and most admirable summary of what His lifestyle was: service to all.

Why do we use the image of our lady of Guadalupe as a powerful symbol for Respect Life Sunday?


Our Lady of Guadalupe is a powerful image of Mary, because the image presents Mary as pregnant, a sign that she was with child when she appeared to a poor Aztec farmer named Juan Diego. The four petal flower over her womb is a sign that she was the mother of God. As the Mother of Jesus, we honor Mary as an important part of his human life, modeling for him responsibility, dignity and love. Mary is also one of our primary examples of faith, as Our Mother, she teaches us about saying yes to God, about humble and quiet discipleship.

It is very appropriate that we honor Our Lady of Guadalupe on this day, because she is the Patroness of the Americas (including North America) and the Patroness of the Unborn Child. Because Mary appeared in this form she is a symbol of the respect for life at all stages of life, because she appeared to Juan Diego at a time of bloody sacrifice, when the culture of that time engaged in human sacrifice, failing to respect the dignity of life. Her message was one of dignity and respect for all human life.

October 20th/21st Respect Life Weekend

The appearance of Our Lady of Guadalupe is miraculous in that her image appeared on a cloak worn by Juan Diego known as a tilma. The tilma still exists today, as does the image. No modern photo company can reproduce this miraculous image of Mary on the tilma hanging high in protected glass above the altar in the Basilica in Mexico City. It is as fresh today as the day it was seen. It is transparent in the back and opaque in the front. It has withstood 100 years open to salt air with both swords and the touch of human hands placing it in harm's way of destruction, and yet nothing can devastate it. Not bullet, nor bomb, let alone the smoke from the many candles burning throughout the years when the image was not in protected glass. Truly, God has preserved it. In the first twenty years, the cactus fiber cloth should have been deteriorating. No paint brush can reproduce it, for it has not the strokes of a human artist.

The Aztecs had no language, but they understood the symbols of the tilma, so it was instrumental in bringing them to conversion, strengthening their faith. An angel is bringing Mary to earth, she is standing on the moon wearing a mantle of stars. Mary is saying that Jesus is more powerful than the earth, moon, sun and stars. Mary appears humble and obedient to God, filled with faith, outshining the sun but radiating the Son of God. Today the message is the same.

¿Sus caminos no son Mis caminos

En el camino a Jerusalén, Jesús advierte a sus discípulos sobre el destino doloroso que le espera a él y a los que siguen Sus pasos. Pero el despiste general de quienes lo acompañan es increíble. Incluso hoy continuamos despistados.

Santiago y Juan, los hijos de Zebedeo, se separan del resto del grupo y se acercan a Jesús. Parece que no necesitan del resto del grupo. Simplemente desean hacerse con las posiciones de poder más privilegiados y ser los primeros en lo que perciben como el proyecto de Jesús. Su solicitud no es una petición humilde sino una ambición ridícula: "Concede que en tu gloria podamos sentarnos uno a tu derecha y el otro a tu izquierda". Quieren que Jesús los coloque por encima del resto de los discípulos.

Jesús parece sorprendido. "No saben lo que piden". Ellos no han entendido a Jesús. Con gran paciencia, Jesús los invita a preguntarse si van a poder compartir su doloroso destino. Dicen que sí, aunque no entienden de manera clara lo que Jesús realmente quiere decir.

Cuando los otros diez discípulos se enteran de lo que está pasando, se enojan con Santiago y Juan. Ellos también tienen las mismas

aspiraciones. La ambición los divide y los enfrenta. La búsqueda de honores y de jugar papeles protagonistas siempre rompe y divide la comunión de la comunidad cristiana. Esto es verdad también hoy. ¿Qué podría ser más contrario a Jesús y su proyecto de servir a la liberación del pueblo?

Este evento fue tan serio e inquietante que Jesús "los convocó" para dejar claro cuál debería ser la actitud que caracteriza a su discípulo. Ya saben cómo se comportan los romanos «los gobernantes del pueblo» y



«señores» de la tierra: tiranizan a la gente, la someten y hacen sentir todo el peso de su poder sobre la gente. Jesús los insta a que "nada de esto" tenga lugar entre ellos.

Entre sus seguidores, todo tiene que ser diferente: «el que quiera ser grande entre ustedes será su servidor; quien quiera ser el primero entre ustedes será el esclavo de todos. La grandeza no se mide por el poder que uno puede poseer, el grado que uno puede llevar o los títulos que uno

ganó. El que desea poseer estas cosas, en la Iglesia de Jesús, no es una gran persona, es el más insignificante y ridículo. De hecho, los títulos y la grandeza pueden ser un obstáculo para el crecimiento en el estilo de vida deseado por el Crucificado. En la Iglesia de Jesús, todos deben ser siervos. Cada uno de nosotros debe colocarse en la comunidad cristiana, no desde arriba, desde la superioridad, el poder o el protagonismo interesado, sino desde abajo, desde la disponibilidad y el servicio.

FEATURED PARISH MINISTRY: CONSEJO PASTORAL


This week we pray in gratitude for those serving our parish community as part of the Consejo Pastoral. Lord bless those who are serving in this ministry with courage and perseverance and grant that many will be inspired by their example and faith. Help the men and women of our parish to hear your call to serve our community in a ministry to address their own needs and those of our parish who thirst for your presence.

The Consejo Pastoral gathers once a month to plan activities within our Spanish speaking community, providing advice and ideas to staff and clergy to help grow and expand the Christian faith. Today, nationwide about one in five US adults say their primary religious affiliation is with the Catholic Church. Those numbers have remained steady because of the growth of Latino Catholics. Recently we've also seen a significant shift of the nation's Catholic population toward the South and West, which has now brought about an evenly balanced distribution of the overall Catholic population across the Northeast, Midwest, South and West. Hispanic Catholics, however, are more heavily concentrated in the South and West. This parish group is engaging with these demographic and geographic shifts in an attempt to better address the spiritual needs of our Catholic community.
