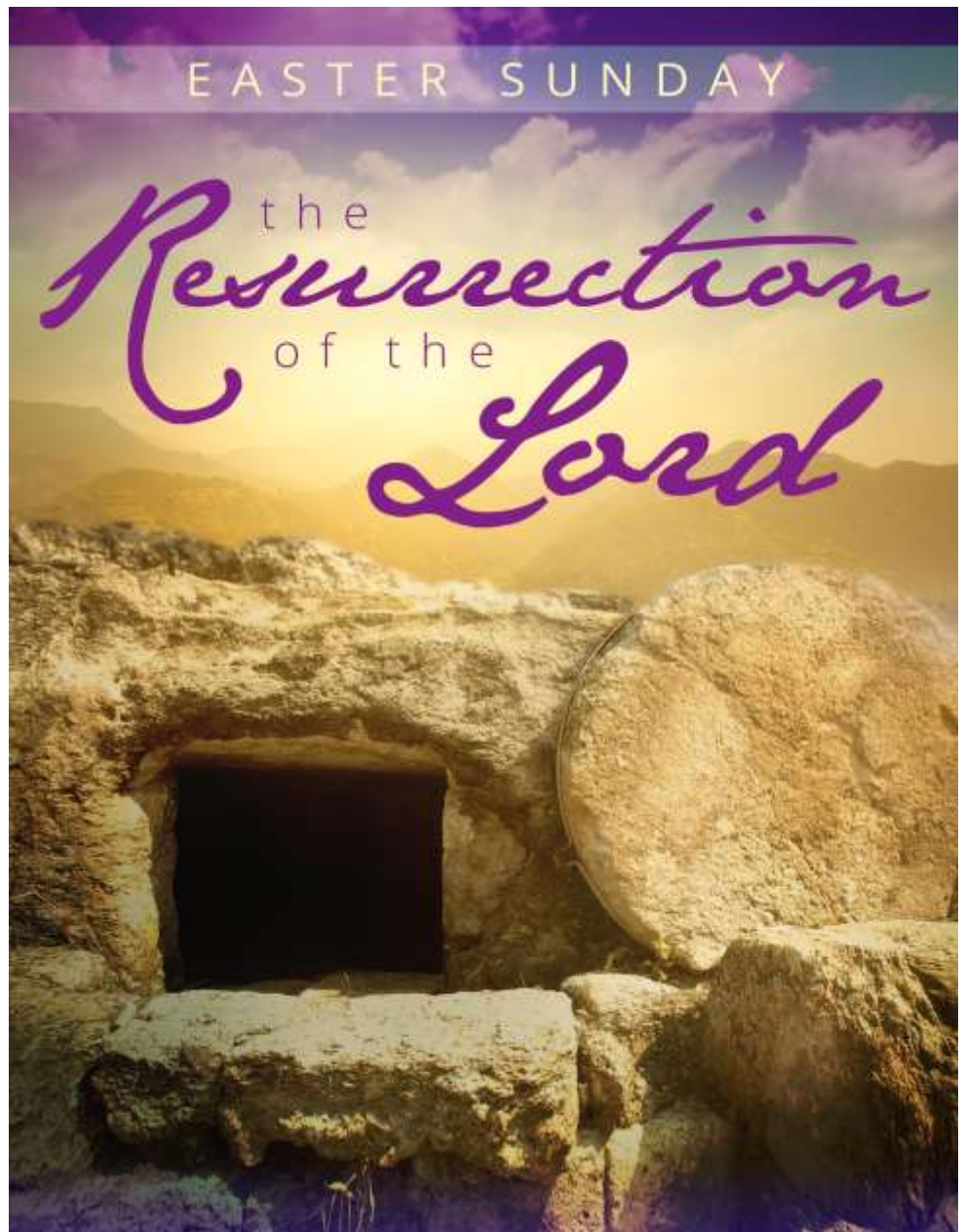

# FR. ANTONIO'S CORNER

## *A Reflection for Easter Sunday*



### Where to Find the Risen Lord?

Faith in Jesus, the One raised from the dead by the Father, did not flow naturally and spontaneously in the hearts of the disciples. It was not the result of a magic intervention. Before they encountered ("experienced") him, full of life, the Gospels speak about their disorientation, about their search around the tomb, and about their questions and uncertainties.

Mary of Magdala is the best prototype of what probably happens in all of us. According to John's account, she looks for the crucified one, in the middle of darkness. It was "when it was still dark." Logically, she looks for Him "in the tomb." She is not yet aware of the fact that death has been conquered. Therefore, the empty tomb leaves her puzzled. Without Jesus, she feels lost.

The other Gospels refer to yet another early tradition, which describes a whole group of women in search of Jesus. They cannot forget the Master who welcomed them as His disciples: their love for Him leads them to the tomb. They did not find Jesus there, but heard the message, which tells them where they must guide their search: "Why do you search among the dead the One who is alive? He is not here. He has risen."

Faith in the risen Christ does not come in us, even today, spontaneously, just because we have heard about it since childhood to our parents, catechists, and preachers. To open ourselves to faith in the resurrection of Jesus,

we must walk our own way. It is crucial not to forget Jesus, to love him passionately, to believe with words and actions in his very same dream, and seek him with all our energies, but not in the world of the dead. Jesus is to be found where there is life—abundant life.

If we wish to encounter the risen Christ, full of life and creative energy, then we must seek him, not in a dead religion, reduced to the external and formalistic compliance of laws and regulations, and the intellectual adherence to certain cold dogmas and doctrines, but there where people live according to the Spirit of Jesus, received with faith, love and responsibility.



We are to seek Him, not among divided Christians struggling for sterile discussions and theological arguments, empty of love for Jesus and

passion for the Gospel, but there where communities are formed where Christ is placed **at the center because they know that "where two or three are gathered in his name, He is there in the middle."**

The living One is not to be found in a worn-out faith supported only by all sorts of platitudes and empty formulas. The Risen One is to be found in the process of forging a new relationship with him, and in our capacity to fully identify ourselves with His great project of the building of the Kingdom of God in the world.

A dull and lifeless Jesus, who does not make us fall in love nor seduces, who does not touch our hearts and does not create the freedom of **the children of God, is a "dead Jesus."** He is not the living Christ, resurrected by the Father.

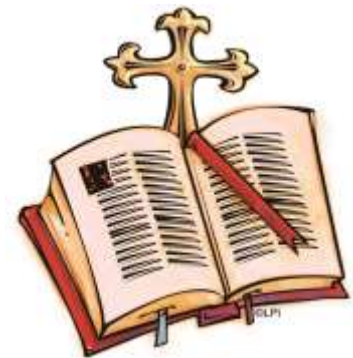

**CHANGE OF POSTURE** Following the decision of Bishop Peter Christensen, beginning this weekend—April 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> (2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter)—during Mass the faithful are to **KNEEL** upon the **completion** of the recitation or singing of the "Lamb of God" or Agnus Dei and remain kneeling until they stand for the communion procession. Those unable to kneel are to sit. With this decision Bishop Peter also stated, "The encouraged posture in receiving communion is to remain standing." With this change, all should keep in mind the instruction given in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, #42, "A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them."

# LIFELONG CONVERSION

EASTER: RISING FROM THE ASHES. As most of you are aware, Holy Week began with the destructive fire of Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris, France. This eight century old church was a universal symbol for the Catholic Church and now there are ashes where once people gathered to worship. We'll see as it develops, but Notre Dame will hopefully rise from those ashes: from its apparent death it will find new life and once again it will be a mecca for many to come and stand in awe of what our ancestors built because of their faith.



This sad occurrence is a powerful reminder of the Easter message. On Good Friday the disciples were lost, with their leader Jesus killed and buried. All seemed lost, until the Resurrection of Christ. So has people of faith we will join in prayer with all those praying that this icon of Western Civilization will be restored to its splendor, to again serve as a powerful testimonial of the Christian faith. But beyond this tragic event in Paris, we will take away the larger message that we have again commemorated with Holy Week: the death and resurrection of our Savior. Let us prayer that we will take renewed resolve to continue building our faith literally and metaphorically. There will always be fires big and small, real and metaphorical, in all our lives. May we take the blessing of the Easter message to remain committed to our lifelong conversion to know and do God's will.

There is now a hole in the middle of Paris, and there is a God-shaped hole in all of us. As St. Augustine noted, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

## ¿Dónde encontrar al Señor resucitado?



La fe en Jesús, el que fue resucitado por el Padre, no nació de manera natural y espontánea en los corazones de los discípulos. No fue el resultado de una intervención mágica. Antes de que se encontraran (= experimentaron) con él, lleno de vida, los Evangelios hablan sobre su desorientación, sobre su búsqueda alrededor de la tumba y sobre sus preguntas e incertidumbres.

María Magdalena es el mejor prototipo de lo que probablemente ocurra en todos nosotros. Según el relato de Juan, ella busca al crucificado, en medio de la oscuridad. Era "cuando todavía estaba oscuro".

Lógicamente, ella lo busca "en la tumba". Aún no es consciente del hecho de que la muerte ha sido conquistada. Por lo tanto, la tumba vacía la deja desconcertada. Sin Jesús, ella se siente perdida.

Los otros evangelios se refieren a otras tradiciones más tempranas, que describen a todo un grupo de mujeres en busca de Jesús. No pueden olvidar al Maestro que las recibió como Sus discípulos: su amor por Él las lleva a la tumba. No encontraron a Jesús allí, pero escucharon el mensaje, que les dice hacia

dónde deben guiar su búsqueda: "¿Por qué buscan entre los muertos el que está vivo? Él no está aquí. Ha resucitado."

La fe en Cristo resucitado no viene a nosotros, incluso hoy, espontáneamente, solo porque lo hemos escuchado desde la infancia a nuestros padres, catequistas y predicadores. Para abrirnos a la fe en la resurrección de Jesús, debemos recorrer nuestro propio camino. Es crucial no olvidar a Jesús, amarlo apasionadamente, creer con palabras y acciones en su mismo sueño y buscarlo con todas nuestras energías, pero no en el mundo de los muertos. Jesús se encuentra donde hay vida, y vida en abundancia.

Si deseamos encontrarnos con el Cristo resucitado, lleno de vida y energía creativa, entonces debemos buscarlo, no en una religión muerta, reducido al cumplimiento formal y externo de unas leyes y regulaciones, o la adhesión intelectual a ciertos dogmas y doctrinas frías, pero allí donde las personas viven según el Espíritu de Jesús, y lo reciben con fe, amor y responsabilidad.

Debemos buscarlo, no entre cristianos divididos que luchan con discusiones estériles



y argumentos teológicos, vacíos de amor por Jesús y la pasión por el Evangelio, sino que allí donde se forman comunidades donde se coloca a Cristo en el centro, porque saben que "donde dos o tres están reunidos en su nombre, Él está allí en medio".

El Resucitado no se encuentra allí donde hay una fe gastada y lánguida apoyada solo por argumentos y fórmulas vacíos de contenido. El Resucitado se encuentra allí donde se da un proceso para forjar una nueva relación con él, y en nuestra capacidad de identificarnos plenamente con Su gran proyecto de la construcción del Reino de Dios en el mundo.

Un Jesús aburrido y sin vida, que no nos enamora ni seduce, que no toca nuestros corazones y no crea la libertad de los hijos de Dios, es un "Jesús muerto". Él no es el Cristo vivo, resucitado por el padre.

UN CAMBIO EN LA POSTURA: Siguiendo la decisión del Monseñor Obispo Pedro Christensen, a partir del domingo, 28 de abril (2º Domingo de Pascua) en la Misa los fieles deben **ARRODILLARSE** al **cumplir** la recitación o canto del "Cordero de Dios" y seguir arrodillados hasta que se ponen de pie para la procesión de la comunión. Los que no puedan arrodillarse deben sentarse. Con esta decisión el Obispo también dijo, "La postura recomendada para recibir la comunión (la hostia) es parado." Con este cambio, todos deben tomar en cuenta la instrucción de la *Institución General del Misal Romano, #42*: "La postura uniforme, seguida por todos los que toman parte en la celebración, es un signo de unidad de los miembros de la comunidad Cristiana congregada para la sagrada Liturgia, ya que expresa y fomenta al mismo tiempo la unanimidad de los participantes."
