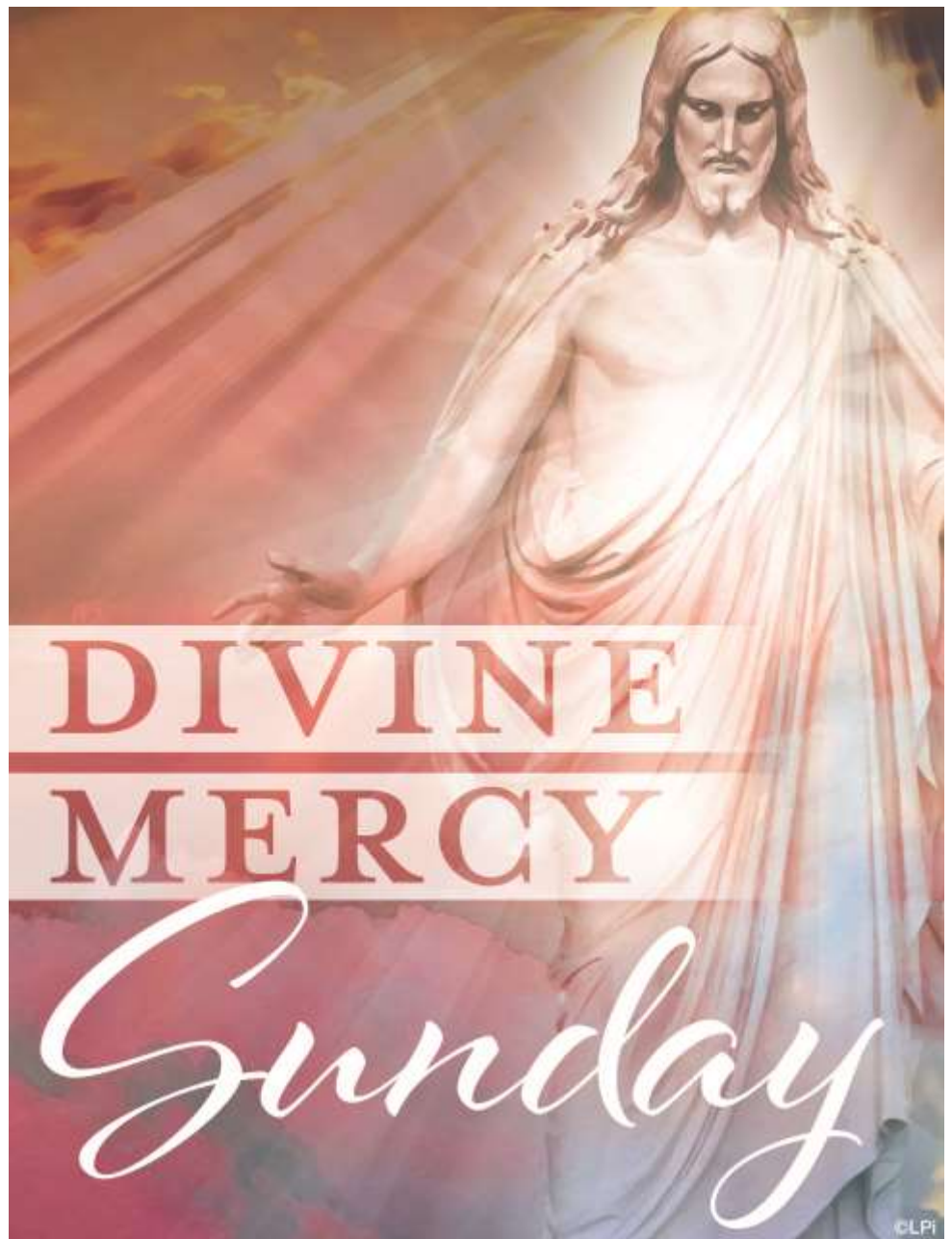

CHANGE OF POSTURE Following the decision of Bishop Peter Christensen, beginning this weekend—April 27th-28th (2nd Sunday of Easter)—during Mass the faithful are to **KNEEL** upon the **completion** of the recitation or singing of the "Lamb of God" or Agnus Dei and remain kneeling until they stand for the communion procession. Those unable to kneel are to sit. With this decision Bishop Peter also stated, "The encouraged posture in receiving communion is to remain standing." With this change, all should keep in mind the instruction given in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, #42, "A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them."

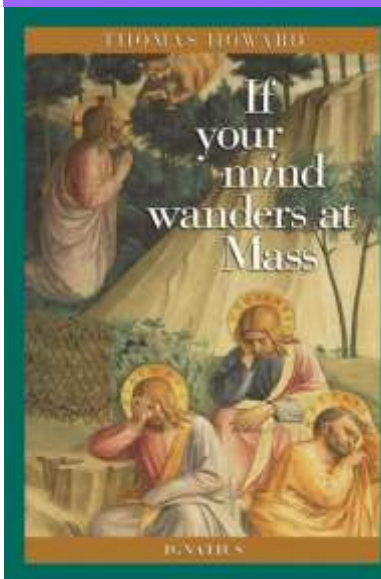

LIFELONG CONVERSION



THE MASS So much of our Catholic faith revolves around the mass. Thus if you want to learn more about your faith, the mass is a great place to focus your attention. Fortunately, there are some great resources that are available, included Bishop Robert Barron's "The Mass." You can go online to www.WordonFire.org to find out more about this series if you might be interested in purchasing it. Then there's also a great free resource on Formed.org titled "If your mind wanders at Mass" by Thomas Howard. Distractions, fatigue, boredom at Sunday worship—maybe we experience these because we don't fully appreciate what's going on at Mass. Howard's profound and practical look at the liturgy focuses our wandering minds. It reminds us that at Mass the veil separating earth and heaven lifts, so that we stand with angels and saints in the presence of God Most High. Find out more about it by going to www.Formed.org. This is a great online resource for learning more about your Catholic faith, and it's free access for parishioners when you use the code 82F2DN when you register.

CATHOLIC POSTURES For an outsider, the Catholic mass can be confusing with all of the changes in posture from sitting, to standing to kneeling, etc. But there are reasons for all of these changes in postures. This weekend we re-commence a Catholic custom of kneeling after the Agnus Dei or "Lamb of God" as we go into the shared response of "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." This line is derived from the Gospel of Matthew from the words spoken by the Roman centurion to Jesus when he begged the Lord to heal his sick servant. While this unusual language may feel uncomfortably distant as compared to the incredible intimacy of Holy Communion as some

have noted, it's important for us to realize that these words are spoken in preparation for the Divine encounter; this is not the moment of intimacy itself. Our response, in other words, is intended to orient our thoughts in such way as to help us embrace the breathtaking reality of what is about to take place. This is an important distinction! Bishop Peter who directed this change for the Diocese stated that he believes this "will foster and express a greater reverence for the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It also unites our diocese in practice with other dioceses in our region, as well as with a great many dioceses in the United States."
