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PARISH LEADERSHIP

PARISH COUNCIL/Contact – Bill Bittner: wbittner8@gmail.com Parish Council is a community of disciples called together to work in close consultation with the pastor and staff to prayerfully discern and to carry out the Will of God for this parish now and into the future. Its more specific roles and responsibilities are to: Listen and Respond to the Holy Spirit, Organize Lay Participation and Cooperation, Facilitate Shared Practical Wisdom, Facilitate Parish Planning, Listen to Needs. They meet approximately 6 times a year.

FINANCE COUNCIL/Contact – Marianne Sterr, Chairperson: mariannesterr@gmail.com The Finance Council assists the Pastor in the administration of the financial health of the parish. They work closely with the Pastor and parish staff on the annual budget, facilities maintenance, financial planning and fundraising to allow the parish to achieve its missionary goals. The Finance Council has three subcommittees: Building and Grounds, Cemetery and Endowment Committees. They meet at 6:00 pm on the third Thursday of each month. Quarterly this meeting is a joint meeting with the Pastoral Council.

SUB-COMMITTEES OF FINANCE COUNCIL:

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS/Contact - Bill Wallingford: wrw5446@sbcglobal.net This committee is responsible for the maintenance and repair of St. Margaret Mary's physical facilities. This includes identifying needs, working with Finance Council for funding and providing leadership to completion. This committee needs additional members who can range from "handymen" to those with extensive knowledge.

GARDEN COMMITTEE/Contact - Bill Wallingford: wrw5446@sbcglobal.net A group of parishioners who like to keep the grounds of St. Margaret Mary looking great. Each planted bed on the campus is assigned to volunteer(s). They are responsible for making sure the beds are well kept. Beds are populated with plants that need reduced care such as evergreens and perennials. There is no heavy lifting (mulching is done by student volunteers each spring): just weeding, an occasional drink during a dry spell, deadheading, pruning dead branches. These activities are done as your schedule permits. Time commitment averages an hour a week. There is one planning meeting per season.

ATTA-BOYZ/Contact – Bill Wallingford: wrw5446@sbcglobal.net A group of on-call parishioners who help with simpler projects on the campus. Activities include broadcast fertilizer spreading 3-4 times a summer, dismantling old equipment for recycling, cleaning out a storage room, setting up and taking down chairs for events, digging holes for new/replacement plants, edging beds. Members provide their emails and text numbers so they can be contacted when a need arises and respond whether or not they can help. Your commitment depends on your availability and physical fitness. Time commitment can start from 1 hour a month to whatever can fit in your schedule. If you have a specialty skill or are a trades craftsman, your skills can be put to good use on small projects.

- **Soup for Homebound Parishioners**--A small group of parishioners continue to stock our parish office freezer with a variety of soups. A parish volunteer brings soup and prayer to homebound parishioners.
- **Meals for Parishioners**--A great group of volunteer parishioners await the request of the parish to prepare full meals for members recovering from illness or recently released from the hospital.
- **Fox Valley Warming Shelter**--Several times each year we choose a week to provide the needed volunteers and food for the Fox Valley Warming Shelter in Appleton. Parishioners are recruited to cook and serve the well-rounded meals and be present through several evening and overnight shifts.
- **Noon Meal Outreach**--Several times a year we prepare and serve the noon meal at our community's free noon meal sites. We are active participants in their annual Community Christmas Dinner too.
- **Meals for COTS Homeless Shelter**-- **Contact – Deacon Dan Laurent: dc7laurent@hotmail.com** COTS is a shelter helping homeless individuals in Appleton transition to self-sufficiency and independent living. St. Margaret Mary prepares and delivers a meal for the 20 residents on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. Each family supplies 1 gallon of chicken noodle soup 1 time per year based on a set appointed schedule.

FUNERAL MEAL MINISTRY/Contact – Laura Lambert: emtmomof2@gmail.com (920)740-7772 The Funeral Meal ministry serves lunch after funerals. Duties include setting up tables & chairs, making coffee/lemonade, setting the food and beverage areas, serving beverages, monitoring the buffet line, and clearing all the tables when guests are finished eating, wiping tables, cleaning, putting leftover food into containers, and resetting the room after the funeral meal. NO cooking or baking is required. "Dishwashers" in our ministry need to be able to lift heavy racks of dishes in and out of the (hot) commercial grade dishwasher. We need approximately 8 volunteers per funeral meal, depending on how large the funeral meal attendees will be. Volunteers are contacted by call or text. You will be given the opportunity to say "yes" or "no". If you are unable to work a funeral for any reason, we move on to another volunteer. For this reason, we need a pool of many volunteers to be successful in our mission.
