

appreciate your desire to serve our community in these unique and important ministries. As you know, there are basic qualifications required, a vetting process, and you will be required to have a background check done, and have completed your sexual abuse prevention and safety training online sessions required by the Archdiocese.

**Thank you to all these ministers who assisted to make our first weekend back after the onset of the pandemic as smooth as possible. We learned a lot and will make adjustments to further improve our worship experiences in the midst of continuing restrictions for social distancing, wearing masks, hand sanitizing, etc.

6th at 5:30 pm and Sunday, June 7th,
9:00 am. This arrangement is the
result of needing to social distance,
etc.

**Lacey Sorrell, Hanna Reich and Dianne Sowell have been working diligently to help arrange the Confirmation Masses for our candidates. Due to the basic shutdown of everything, Archbishop Gustavo and Bishop Michael have become backlogged in a way that delegation has been granted to all pastors to celebrate the Confirmations in their own parishes. We have set two dates for the Confirmations: Monday, June 29th at 6:30 pm and Monday, July 6th, at 6:30 pm. We must do it in two separate services because of the continuing requirement for social distancing. As pastor it will be a great honor to celebrate the Confirmations with our own Candidates and their families. What an honor!

**It has been a tremendous "let down" for our Staff, our Middle

Schoolers and High Schoolers that our various Edge and Life Teen summer excursions and events have been cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic. On Wednesday, May 20th, Lacey Sorrell, Hannah Reich, Deacon Brad Wakely and Fr. Norman had an initial brainstorming session to explore how to create a "silver lining" in the cancellation of these traditional events. We know that many of the middle schoolers and teens are exhausted from the requirements, stress and anxiety of continuing their studies online from home shut-off from friends and school activities, etc., due to the pandemic shutdown. We also know that less teens will be able to find summer jobs due to the impact on our economy. We will try to design a variety of activities to offer the youth of our parish during these summer weeks. In due time we will publish a pamphlet of our offerings with a description of what they will entail. It will all be for the edification of our youth and their growth in Christ, their Catholic faith and church involvement. This means we will be calling on many of our parishioners to make all this possible. If any of us call you asking your assistance and expertise, please say "Yes!" Keep posted to see what Lacey and Hannah come up with!! This will be our way of letting the youth of our parish know how much we care about them!





Procedures to Re-Open St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church for Public Masses, as adapted from Archbishop Gustavo García-Siller – May 2020

As of May 13, 2020, Archbishop Gustavo, Archbishop of San Antonio, has granted us permission to begin the reopening of public Masses starting May 19, 2020. Archbishop Gustavo issued a decree on March 13, 2020 including dispensation for all Catholics from the obligation to participate in Mass on Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation. This dispensation remains in effect under this Decree and will continue until specifically revoked.

The staff of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church is dedicated to providing parishioners public Mass in a safe environment while following the directives given by the Archdiocese of San Antonio as well as guidelines from the Texas State Health Services Department.

Public Mass resumed on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. Weekend Mass times are as follow: Saturday Vigil Mass is at 5:30pm. Sunday Mass times are 9:00am, 11:00am, 1:00pm (Spanish), and 6:00pm (Life Teen). Daily Masses will be Monday at 6:30pm, Tuesday – Thursday at 8:00am and Friday at 10:00am. Please note that Mass on Monday, May 25th, will be at 8:00am, which is the normal time for holiday Masses.

Church Seating Arrangements

Upon entry to the church, you will notice immediately that chairs have been placed in the center of the Sanctuary. This is a temporary arrangement to help maximize seating while we adhere to social distancing. The ambo has also been temporarily moved to the left of the altar. You may also see cameras in the center aisle so we can continue to film Mass for those who cannot attend.

We apologize if this arrangement causes any consternation, especially to those who fully understand the original design of our sacred space and its proper spiritual design and goal. We have chosen a very practical and functional solution to the greatly reduced seating capacity due to social distancing guidelines.

Capacity & Seat Reservation

- For now, the number of persons allowed to enter the church will be limited to that number which can maintain the social distancing guidelines of a minimum of six feet between families.
 - 260 in the church and 175 in the Cana Ballroom.
- Because it is impossible to accommodate all our parishioners for Sunday Masses, we are asking parishioners to reserve their seats online before each weekend. https:// www.stpetersboerne.com/.
- Those who show up without a seat reservation will be placed in a standby line and will be seated only if capacity is not met due to "noshows," or they will be offered a seat in the Cana Ballroom, space permitting.
- Seat reservation will only apply to Sunday Masses and Saturday Vigil.
 Daily Masses will be first come, first served until capacity is reached.
 Sunday Mass reservations will open each Monday morning.

Before You Arrive

- Parishioners and lay ministers should wash their hands for 20 seconds before leaving home.
- Please always bring your own mask and wear it during Mass.
- Masks are not required for children under 10.
- The nursery is closed.
- Parishioners are encouraged to bring their hand sanitizer that can be used before receiving Holy Communion.
- No one should bring items that contain bleach into the sanctuary, as this will damage the pews.

Mass Arrival Procedures for Parishioners

- · Masks should be worn to all Masses.
- Parishioners may arrive 20-30 minutes before Mass begins to stand in line.
- Each parishioner should print or have their reservation confirmation email pulled up on their phone to show staff when entering. This will speed up the process for all.
- The main doors of the church will open one hour before Mass for the Saturday 5:30pm Mass, the 9:00am and 6:00pm Sunday Masses. Doors

- will open for the 11:00am and 1:00pm Masses as soon as cleaning from the previous Mass is finished.
- The church will be seated to fill the pews by the size of the family. Every other pew will be closed.
- Parishioners that live together may sit together, but six feet distance is required between the households.
 Parishioners are to sit where instructed by ushers.
- Parishioners are not to stop at the baptismal font to bless themselves.
 There are plants around the font to block access to it.
- Anyone without a reserved seat will be asked to stand in a stand-by line. If there is extra seating, they will be granted entrance either in the Sanctuary or Cana Ballroom.
- Seats will be given away 15 minutes before Mass starts.
- Entrance into the church must be done in an orderly fashion while maintaining social distancing guidelines. Please follow the instructions of the ushers.

Mass Procedures

- Masses will be conducted in the same manner as seen on the live stream with reduced volunteer lay ministers. There will be no altar servers, choirs, or lay sacristans.
- There will not be any loose printing materials such as songbooks, missals, etc. Bulletins will be available outside after Mass.
- Lectors and readers will not process in with the priest.
- Everyone must keep face masks on for the duration of Mass.
- There is to be no physical contact between households at the sign of peace or hand-holding during the Lord's Prayer. Greet each other with a wave, a nod of your head or with another respectful gesture.
- Baskets will not be passed during the offertory. An usher will walk in the empty rows so that offerings may be placed in the basket, though we encourage online giving through: https:// stpetersboerne.weshareonline.org/ ws/opportunities/ GeneralOffertoryCollection

Ministers of Hospitality (Ushers)

 Ushers must always wear masks and gloves and switch out to new

- gloves after each Mass. We are requesting ushers bring their own mask and gloves.
- Parish staff or volunteers will be stationed at the entrance of the church, confirming the parishioner has a reservation for the Mass. They can show a printed copy, their cell phone or we also have ticket stubs they can use to enter. Please try to keep the line moving.
- Parish staff or volunteers with counters will be at the entrance into the Sanctuary. They will be keeping count so we know how many standby parishioners we can let in.
- Stand-by parishioners may be let in starting 15 minutes before Mass.
- Families can sit together but must be six feet apart from the next family.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC)

- The congregation will stand in both the church and the Cana Ballroom, and the EMHC will take Communion to the parishioners by walking through the empty aisles.
- The six stations in the Sanctuary will be the same, plus we added two in the front of the altar for the priest and the deacon for those seated in the center, though again parishioners will stand and the EMHC will bring Communion to the congregation.
- EMHC must wear masks at all times and distribute in the hand only.
- If a parishioner requests to receive by the tongue, please inform them you have been instructed by the Archbishop, for the safety of all, only to distribute in the hand.
- EMHC will not stand around the altar to receive the paten (ciboria), but rather the EMHC will stand in the line marked with tape to keep social distancing. You will be instructed to come forward to receive your paten (ciboria). For those going to the Cana Ballroom, Debra Martini will escort you to the ballroom.
- There will be six EMHC for the ballroom. Each EMHC will distribute Communion to each person in their assigned row. The parishioners will stand and the EMHC will walk to each person in their row to offer Communion.

 After the Cana Ballroom EMHC offer Communion, they will all return together, led by Debra Martini to the tabernacle where the extra hosts will be combined.

Communion Procedures

- Archbishop Gustavo has instructed that Communion is not offered on the tongue for the protection of our priests, deacons, EMHC and parishioners.
- The Precious Blood will not be offered to the congregation.
- The Communion stations will be the same, plus we added two more in front of the altar for those sitting in the center.
- Parishioners will not come forward to receive Communion; instead the EMHC will go to them. Parishioners should stand and wait for the EMHC to go to them.
- Masks should be worn at all times.
 You may lower your mask as you receive Communion in your hand.
 After Communion, the mask should be raised immediately.

Mass Departure Procedures

- After the final blessing, parishioners are to remain in their seats for dismissal instructions.
- Pews will be dismissed in an orderly fashion starting in the rear of the church and then moving forward.
 Exits will be through the main doors and the two side doors by the Holy Family and Our Lady of Guadalupe chapels.
- Private prayer is not available after Sunday Masses to allow the church to be professionally cleaned and disinfected for the next Mass.
- Clergy have been instructed not to be in the narthex before or after Mass for their own protection and that of the parishioners.
- Parishioners are not to congregate outside but head directly to their vehicles to allow the next Mass to start on time.

Church and Cana Ballroom Cleaning and Sanitization

To rebuild trust and confidence about attending public celebration of the Mass, the parish staff has arranged to have our professional cleaning company, Lone Star Cleaning, do the cleaning and sanitization of the Sanctuary, bathrooms, and Cana Ballroom after

all Masses. This is being done for your health and protection. They are following all CDC guidelines, including a complete wipe down of all the pews, and the spraying of an approved disinfectant. To clean the church expeditiously and adequately, the church will be locked between Masses.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. This is being done for the common good of maintaining public health. Please rest assured we are doing our best to make your church safe and clean for gathering in worship.

When to Return to Mass – A Personal Decision

Archbishop Gustavo strongly encourages those 65 and over and those who are at-risk or are part of the vulnerable health population to stay at home and participate in Mass via our live stream online. At-risk and vulnerable populations include:

- 65 years old or older
- Chronic Lung Disease
- Heart Disease
- Diabetes
- Kidney Disease
- Liver Disease
- Weakened Immune System
- Pregnant Women
- Known to be in close contact with someone who had COVID-19

Even if you are healthy but experience any of the following symptoms, you should not come to Mass. Please consult with your doctor for further diagnosis if you have any of the following symptoms:

- Chronic Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Chills
- · Repeated shaking with chills
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- · Sore throat
- · Loss of taste or smell
- Diarrhea
- Feeling feverish or a measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit

The guiding principle that parishioners should follow in deciding when to first return to public Mass is to be attentive to not only your health but everyone's health and welfare. The bottom line is, only come back when you are ready. The Archbishop has given dispensation for all Catholics from the obligation to participate in Mass on Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation. This dispensation remains in effect under this Decree and will continue until specifically revoked.

Procedimientos para Reabrir la Iglesia Católica de San Pedro Apóstol para las Misas Públicas adaptada del Arzobispo Gustavo García-Siller - Mayo 2020

A partir del 13 de mayo de 2020, el Arzobispo Gustavo, Arzobispo de San Antonio nos ha concedido permiso para comenzar la reapertura de las misas públicas comenzando el 19 de mayo de 2020. El Arzobispo Gustavo emitió un decreto el 13 de marzo de 2020 que incluye la dispensa para todos los Católicos de la obligación de participar en Misa los domingos y otros días santos de obligación. Esta dispensación permanece vigente bajo este decreto y continuará hasta que se revoque específicamente.

El personal de la Iglesia Católica San Pedro Apóstol se dedica a brindar Misa pública a los feligreses en un ambiente seguro, siguiendo las directrices de la Arquidiócesis de San Antonio, así como las directrices del Departamento de Servicios de Salud del Estado de Texas.

La Misa pública se reanudará el martes 19 de mayo de 2020. Los horarios de la Misa del fin de semana serán: Misa de Vigilia del sábado es a las 5:30 p.m. Las Misas en domingo serán a las 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m. (español) y 6:00 p.m. (Life Teen). Las Misas diarias serán lunes a las 6:30 p.m., 8:00 a.m. de martes a jueves y viernes a las 10:00 a.m. La Misa del lunes 25 de mayo será a las 8:00 a.m., que es el tiempo normal para las Misas Festivas.

Arreglos de asientos de la iglesia

Al entrar a la iglesia, notará de inmediato que hay sillas en el centro del Santuario. Este es temporal para maximizar cuantas personas podemos sentar con el distanciamiento social. El Ambón también se ha movido temporalmente a la izquierda del altar. También puede ver cámaras en el pasillo central para que podamos continuar filmando misa para aquellos que no pueden asistir.

Nos disculpamos si este arreglo causa alguna consternación, especialmente a aquellos que entienden completamente el diseño original de nuestro espacio sagrado y su diseño y meta espiritual adecuada. Elegimos una solución muy práctica y funcional para la capacidad de asientos muy reducida debido al distanciamiento social.

Capacidad y reservaciones de asiento

- Por ahora, el número de personas que pueden estar en la iglesia se limitará a ese número que puede mantener las reglas del distanciamiento social con un mínimo de seis pies entre las familias.
 - 260 en la Iglesia y 175 en el salón de Cana.
- Debido a que es imposible acomodar a todos nuestros feligreses para las Misas en domingo, les pedimos a los feligreses que reserven sus asientos en línea antes de cada fin de semana. https:// www.stpetersboerne.com/ o llamen at la oficina parroquial a (830) 816-2233.
- Los que llegan sin una reservación de asiento serán colocados en una fila de espera y se sentarán solo si no se cumple la capacidad debido a "no presentarse".
- La reservación de asiento solo se aplicará a las Misas del domingo y la Vigilia del sábado. Las Misas diarias se recibirán por orden de llegada hasta que se alcance la capacidad. Las reservaciones de asiento se abren cada lunes en la mañana.

Antes de llegar

- Los feligreses y los Ministros Laicos deben lavarse las manos por 20 segundos antes de salir de casa.
- Favor de traer su cubre boca propria and usar durante todo la Misa.

- Niños quien tienen menos de 10, no tienen que llevar un cubre boca.
- La guardería está cerrada.
- Se alienta a los feligreses a traer su propio desinfectante de manos que se pueda usar antes de recibir la Sagrada Comunión.
- Nadie debe traer artículos que contengan cloro al santuario ya que esto dañará los bancos de la iglesia.

Procedimientos de llegada a Misa para feligreses

- Se deben usar cubre boca en todas las Misas.
- Los feligreses pueden llegar 20-30 minutos antes de que la Misa comience a hacer fila.
- Cada feligrés debe imprimir o recibir su correo electrónico de confirmación en su teléfono para mostrar al personal al entrar. Esto acelerará el proceso para todos.
- Las puertas principales de la iglesia se abrirán una hora antes de la Misa para la Misa del sábado a las 5:30 pm, y las Misas del domingo a las 9:00am y 6:00pm. Las Misas de 11:00 am y 1:00 pm se abrirán después de que la iglesia se haya limpiado de la Misa anterior.
- La iglesia se sentará para llenar las bancas por el tamaño de la familia.
- Los feligreses que viven juntos pueden sentarse juntos, pero se requiere una distancia de seis pies entre los hogares. Los feligreses deben sentarse donde lo indique los Ministros de Hospitalidad.
- Nadie debe detenerse en la Fuente Bautismal para bendecirse. Hay plantas alrededor de la fuente para bloquear el acceso a ella.
- Si alguien llega sin una reservación de asiento, se les pedirá que se paren en una "fila de espera". Si hay asientos disponibles, se les permitirá la entrada.
- Los asientos disponibles se regalarán 15 minutos antes de comenzar la Misa.
- La entrada a la Iglesia debe hacerse de manera ordenada manteniendo las reglas del distanciamiento social. Por favor, siga las instrucciones de los Ministros de Hospitalidad.
- Procedimientos para la Misa
- Las Misas se llevarán a cabo de la misma manera que se ve en la

- transmisión en línea con Ministros Laicos voluntarios reducidos. No habrá monaguillos, coros o sacristas laicos.
- No habrá materiales de impreso, como cancioneros, misales, etc.
- Los Lectores no se procesarán con el Sacerdote.
- Todos necesitan llevar sus cubre bocas durante la Misa.
- No debe haber contacto físico entre los hogares en el Signo de la Paz o tomarse de la mano durante el Padre Nuestro. Salúdense con un gesto de la mano, un movimiento de cabeza o con otro gesto respetuoso.
- No se pasarán canastas durante el ofertorio. Un Ministro de Hospitalidad caminará en las filas vacías para que las ofrendas se puedan colocar en la canasta. También puede mandar donaciones en línea a través de: https:// stpetersboerne.weshareonline.org/ ws/opportunities/ GeneralOffertoryCollection

Ministros de hospitalidad (ujieres)

- Los Ministros de Hospitalidad deben usar cubre boca y guantes en todo momento y cambiarse a guantes nuevos después de cada Misa. Pedimos a los Ministros de Hospitalidad traer su propia cubre boca y guantes.
- Los empleados de la parroquia o los voluntarios estarán estacionados en la entrada de la Iglesia, confirmando que los feligreses tienen una reservación para la Misa. Los feligreses pueden mostrar una copia impresa, una copia en su teléfono celular o también tenemos talones de boletos que pueden usar para entrar. Por favor, trate de mantener la línea en movimiento.
- Los empleados de la parroquia o los voluntarios estarán a la entrada del Santuario con contadores.
 Seguirán contando para que sepamos cuántos feligreses "en espera" podemos dejar entrar.
- Se dejará entrar a los feligreses "en espera" 15 minutos antes de la Misa.
- Las familias pueden sentarse juntas, pero deben estar a seis pies de distancia de la próxima familia.

Ministros extraordinarios de Sagrada Comunión (EHMC)

- La congregación se parará tanto en la iglesia como en el salón de Cana, y el EMHC llevará la comunión a los feligreses caminando por los pasillos vacíos.
- Las seis estaciones en el Santuario serán las mismas, además agregamos dos en frente del Altar para el Sacerdote y el Diácono para los que están sentados en el centro, aunque nuevamente los feligreses se pararán y el EMHC llevará la Comunión a ellos.
- EMHC debe usar cubre boca todo el tiempo y distribuir comunión solo en la mano.
- Si un feligrés pide recibir comunión en la lengua, infórmele que se le ha dado instrucciones del arzobispo para la seguridad de todos solo de distribuir comunión en la mano.
- EMHC no se parará alrededor del Altar para recibir la patena, sino que se mantendrá en la línea marcada con cinta azul para mantener el distanciamiento social. Se le indicará que se presente para recibir su patena. Para aquellos que van al salón de Cana, Debra Martini los acompañará.
- Habrá seis EMHC para el salón de Cana. Cada EMHC distribuirá
 Comunión a cada persona en su fila asignada. Los feligreses se pararán y el EMHC caminará hacia cada persona en su fila para ofrecer la comunión.
- Después de la comunión en el salón de Cana, todos los EHMC regresarán juntos, guiados por Debra Martini al tabernáculo donde se combinará todas las hostias.

Procedimientos para Comunión

- El Arzobispo Gustavo ha instruido que la comunión no se ofrece en la lengua por el momento para la protección de nuestros Sacerdotes, Diáconos, EMHC y feligreses.
- La Preciosa Sangre no será ofrecida a la congregación.
- Las estaciones de comunión serán las mismas, además agregamos dos más frente al altar para aquellos que se sientan en el centro.
- Los feligreses no se presentarán para recibir la comunión; en cambio, el EMHC irá a ellos. Los

- feligreses deben ponerse de pie y esperar a que el EMHC vaya a ellos.
- Se deben usar cubre boca todo el tiempo. Puedes bajar tu cubre boca mientras recibes la Comunión n en tu mano. Después de la Comunión, la cubre boca debe levantarse de inmediato.


Procedimientos la salida de Misa
