



Circle of Love "Featured Daughter" *Spiritual Enhancement* by Barbara Ballard



To everything there is a season
I love this scripture from Ecclesiastes. I have a poster of it, a mug printed with it, a pillow embroidered with it, and even wrote a scripture meditation/study based on it for an ACTS team as spiritual companion on the team. I feel like we all have lived it and continue to do so especially at this time. When will this season be over we ask, we demand, we plead, we pray? When, Lord, when?

We think back on seasons of our life that we endured and enjoyed, welcomed and dismissed, worked and played, withered and grew, and doubted and just knew. Lots of seasons. We have persevered through so many seasons, especially those of us more seasoned. What have we learned? Did we learn?

A huge lesson I learned was that God has us on different paths to later help someone on her path. Most importantly, we can't hurry someone along that path. We just accompany that person where she finds herself. Traveling the path is not easy.

I have traveled the path of a daughter, oldest sister of six siblings in an Air Force family, a friend who kept moving in her childhood, a more stationary friend



who graduated from John Marshall High School, college student in early 70's, wife in a first marriage to an alcoholic spouse, mother of four, single parent of four, college graduate in 1983 from UTSA in elementary education, teacher of many second and third grade students for 24 years, wife in a second marriage for us both, stepmother to two, grandmother of nine (the oldest is 24 the youngest is 5), ACTS sister, spiritual companion on several ACTS teams, writer for all occasions, avid reader, lover of dogs and nature, supporter of the fine arts, fan of herbal remedies, and most important to me a child of God and pro-life Catholic since birth. I've seen seasons come and go. I've been enriched when allowing others to accompany me on my journey and later accompanying others on their journey.

Many times I've asked God when. When is this unfortunate season I'm enduring going to end? When God when? Like the one we all are in now. The most difficult season for me was that of single parent of four and going back to college to finish coursework at this time. Life happens and I didn't do it well sometimes. White Chicken Enchiladas

- 10 soft taco shells or tortillas
 - 2 cups cooked, shredded chicken
 - 2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese (I like the Kraft Tex Mex)
 - 3 Tbsp. butter
 - 3 Tbsp. flour
 - 2 cups chicken broth
 - 1 cup sour cream (I use Greek yogurt)
 - 1 (4 oz) can diced green chillies (these are not hot)
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9x13 pan
 - 2. Mix chicken and 1 cup cheese. Roll up in tortillas and place in pan.
 - 3. In a sauce pan, melt butter, stir in flour and cook 1 minute. Add broth and whisk until smooth. Heat over medium heat until thick and bubbly.
 - 4. Stir in sour cream and chilies. Do not bring to boil, you don't want curdled sour cream.
 - 5. Pour over enchiladas and top with remaining cheese.
 - 6. Bake 22 min and then under high broil for 3 min to brown the cheese.

FTC REPORTS EMAIL SCAMS

The FTC uses the information it gets from people who report scams.. Here's one: reports of [Bitcoin blackmail](#) scams have taken a big jump in the last few weeks. The emails say they hacked into your computer and recorded you visiting adult websites. They threaten to distribute the video to your friends and family within hours, unless you pay into their Bitcoin account. Stop. Don't pay anything. Delete the message. It's a scam.

Based on the timing of this spike, you may get one of these messages because your email was exposed in a recent data breach. That's all talk. But they may really know one of your old – or recent – passwords, and they include it in the message to prove it. If you, or someone you know, get a message like this, please report it to the FTC at www.FTC.gov/Complaint. When you see that, you know it's time to [update your password](#) on that account, and consider updating other passwords, too.

Adding to the above, the [FTC's latest round of warning letters](#) to sellers of unproven products and services, the agency is seeing some far-fetched claims. More than 120 warning letters were sent to marketers making COVID-19 health claims for their products and services. For a complete list, see ftc.gov/coronavirus/warning-letters.




We are happy to welcome our newest CDA member Anne Brunet.

Another hard season was that of blending families in a second marriage. Lots of teenage girls and a deaf stepson who had anger issues on a large scale. But I had glances of and appointments with hope at this time. My son entered seminary at University of Dallas and later at St. Mary's in Houston. He was ordained in 2000 as youngest Texas priest at age 27. He is currently rector at St. Patrick Cathedral in Ft. Worth. His masses and fireside chats these past few weeks have brought me so much comfort. And all this was birthed in the difficult season of single parenting. I felt my son called at age nine while talking to our parish priest at OLG in Helotes. God uses messes to bring messages and messengers of hope.

I can't fix someone else. Just work on me. No miracles for an alcoholic husband who doesn't care anymore. Just get counseling for the children and me. Keep moving forward. Some days a minute at a time. Get back to school and finish. There is a family to raise. Keep moving forward.

God gives us what we need for the day: caring parents, a friend's call, Pell Grants to go back to school, children's insights and hugs, a dog's comfort at night when crying, siblings' encouragement, a son's prayers, daughters' visits, grandchildren's love notes, beautiful songs to listen to, creative moments in writing, dabbles in watercolor, appointments with a piano and gifted composers, inspirational books to ponder, nature to enjoy with a husband on our acreage in Sisterdale.

One will be called to accompany another on a journey. We can't hurry the person to where we are on the journey. We need to go back to where they are and walk with them.

God keeps waiting for us to turn back to Him. He didn't turn away. We did. Remember the book *The Runaway Bunny*? I wanted to share that with you at our April CDA meeting that was cancelled. Such a great book for all ages. A mother bunny pursues her little bunny who is trying to run away from her. Just like the mother bunny, God accompanies us to all levels—from the pits to the heights, from around us to within us, from the friendly occasions to the lonely moments, from the purposeful stations to the purposeless illusions. He is there with us. He waits with us. He comforts us. He encourages us. To everything there is a season. God is there in all our seasons, even this one of isolation from others. "When, God, when?" we ask. Wait, my child, wait on me," God answers.

DIY INSECT HOTEL



STAGE 1: BUILD

Build a simple hotel from scrap wood or create your hotel with a pre-existing structure. Examples: Cookie tin, birdhouse, wine crate, flower pot, milk carton, wooden box, wooden pallet, wooden drawer.



STAGE 2: GATHER

Hunt and gather materials for your insect hotel. Materials to consider: Pine cones, leaves and twigs, moss and grass, bark and wood chips, egg cartons, flower pots, cardboard wrapping paper or toilet paper rolls, hollow reeds (bamboo works well), milk cartons, and plastic bottles.



STAGE 3: CREATE

Start adding in materials to the hotel, creating sections using varying filler if desired. Use a hot glue gun, twine, retired shoelaces, or other if needed to help secure materials to the hotel. If drilling holes for bees, keep in mind that different species are drawn to different size holes. For leafcutter bees, the holes should be 1/4" wide and 2 1/2-4" deep. For mason bees, holes should be 5/16" wide and 6" deep. Never drill entirely through the wooden blocks.



STAGE 4: OPEN & SHARE

Name your insect hotel and put out your vacancy sign. Share your hotel with us on Instagram. Tag us at @lodi_wine and use hashtag #lodirules for a chance to be featured in our stories.
