Reflecting on God's Word

God describes the people to whom Ezekiel is being sent as "hard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). They are a people who have rebelled and revolted against God, but still God persists in sending them a prophet: this time Ezekiel, last time Jeremiah, the time before that Isaiah, all the way back to Samuel and Nathan, Elijah and Elisha. Even today, God continues to send prophets to soften our faces and make yielding our own hearts.

Jesus found hardened faces and stubborn hearts when he went to his hometown. Impenetrable seems to be the best description. His words could not get through. He was proclaiming the kingdom of God, the presence of God among them, and they couldn't hear him. It all depended on what they saw and all they saw was the carpenter, questioning where he got such wisdom and how he did these mighty deeds. He was just the son of Mary! We know the family. Go figure.

And then we hear some of the saddest words in the Gospel: "So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them" (Mark 6:5). Why? Their lack of faith.

So Jesus started a new family. It began with the people whom we have been hearing about—the disciples, for all their struggles to believe in him right up to the very end, but also people like the woman with the hemorrhage, Jairus and his daughter, the man lowered through the roof, the fellow who had an evil spirit. The list goes on and on, down to our own day.

By baptism, we became part of the family, the new family whose bond is not based on blood, but on faith. The ever-recurring question is: Is he able to work any signs among us, or is he amazed at our lack of faith?

A Thorn in the Flesh

If you touch a thorn on a rose, you pull your hand back right away. But when St. Paul talked about "a thorn in the flesh," he described something worse. He felt a constant pain, a thorn stuck there "to beat me, to keep me from being too elated."

No one knows what it was. An illness like shingles? Or something more psychological, such as an annoying coworker or threats from an enemy? Paul doesn't say.

But he didn't like it. "Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me." If such an affliction tormented us, we'd probably not stop after three prayers. We'd pray constantly for relief.

Why only three times? Perhaps because Paul got an answer to his prayers. It brought spiritual relief, but not physical relief. "The Lord said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." It wasn't the answer he wanted. But it was the answer he got.

The hardships we endure remind us of our frailty. We'd like to think we can handle any task, overcome any challenge. But sometimes we cannot. And no one can help. We are left with this stark realization: we are weak.

It is then that Christ can help. The grace of Christ sustains us in good times and in bad, but we only realize it when things go wrong. "When I am weak, then I am strong."

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NOTES ON STEWARDSHIP

Today's Gospel reveals Jesus being amazed that the people in his hometown of Nazareth d not accept his teaching and ministry; he is amazed at their lack of faith (Mk 6:6). Good stewards recognize and participate in Christ's teaching, reconciling and healing presence in their community. Are we good stewards of our family of faith? Do we value and support the ministries that take place in Christ's name? Are we attentive to the movement of the Holy Spirit in our parish and encourage those who work to enhance our life of faith? Housing the Homeless: Vouchers Available, Landlords Needed!

A variety of housing vouchers (rent subsidies) are available statewide for individuals and families who are newly homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless. Unfortunately, the need for housing is greater than what the current inventory provides. The only way for our community to move the dial with housing the houseless is to work together - LANDLORDS ARE NEEDED!



Oahu Housing Now is a collaborative partnership between the C&C of Honolulu and Partners In Care (PIC), a coalition of organizations representing non-profit, private, government and community organizations. PIC is leading Oahu Housing Now by providing capacity building support and technical assistance. The City is supporting the program through CARES Act funding. Each partnering service provider brings to the table their particular area of expertise. Partners have set a goal to re-house at least 300 homeless households, or around 1,000 individuals, by this September. These households will be supported with rent for 12 months and will be provided with the needed wrap-around services for ensuring they're set-up to go into permanent housing when the program concludes.

Oahu Housing Now will apply a Rapid Rehousing approach throughout the course of the program.

Rapid Rehousing is an approach where short-term rental assistance and supportive services are provided to assist with:

- · obtaining housing quickly
- increasing self-sufficiency, and
- · maintaining housing

In addition to Oahu Housing Now, a minimum of 708 **Emergency Housing Vouchers** will be coming to Hawaii through the federal American Rescue Plan Act. These vouchers are specifically for households which are homeless, are at risk of becoming homeless or are fleeing volatile circumstances (e.g. domestic violence, trafficking). With these additional vouchers being made available on all islands, the call out to property owners for open units is even more urgent.

WHAT IS NEEDED are opportunities to raise awareness and to break down barriers and misconceptions of voucher programs and the people who rely on vouchers to maintain a stable life.




