The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King

November 26, 2023

To the Lord belongs glory and power for ever and ever!

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates **the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.**

Late Pope Pius XI instituted this Feast in 1925 with his encyclical **Quas primas ("In the first")** to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to **"thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law"** out of the public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

How timely that this **Feast of Christ the King** be celebrated at every close of one cycle of Liturgical Year - Worship and to enter a new. We as are given the grace opportunity to renew our loyalty and recommitment to Jesus Christ as our only Sovereign Lord and King in all aspects of our life.

Why would this be important and are terms like "King" even relevant to our modern times? Yes, it is and Jesus by his statement "for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Luke 12:34 further revealed that who or what truly reigns in our "the throne - the heart," is the Ruler over us.

The "heart" represents the hidden, deepest, and most intimate part of ourselves and the very source of our lives. The "treasure" represents whatever has most value and gives us security, both today and in the future. (Focolare).

We are faced with daunting secularism that continuous to strip God out of every aspect of our lives and in such society and nation, God's Eternal Laws are trampled underfoot and what were once sin and evil are given acceptance and normalcy.

Sister Lucia dos Santos, one of the visionary and witness to the Fatima apparitions, was forewarned by our Blessed Mother, told late Pope John Paul II, "Father, a time will come when the decisive battle between the kingdom of Christ and Satan will be over marriage and family."

Do we not see those perilous signs with so many marriages and families assaulted and destroyed and Christian value of what marriage and family as God established and blessed them is now cast aside? Truly enthronement of Jesus Christ in our hearts is timely.

The Background History: During the early 20th century, in countries like Mexico, Russia and in some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself.

Late Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics the hope and while governments around them crumbled, the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever.

The encyclical stated, "Jesus Christ is forever truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all humankind." (Quas primas, 7)

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Catholic Church's teaching on the Incarnation. That Jesus is truly God and truly human. He is both divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross.

One Person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. Jesus Christ is to be adored by angels, men, and women.


NOTE ON STEWARDSHIP
