Ambulatio Divina

Walking Humbly with God When we think of prayer, most often we think of being still – standing, kneeling or sitting – while connecting with God. However, being still is not the only way one can pray.

Some people do their best and are most comfortable praying while they are moving. Prayer Walking can be a wonderful gift for those who like to get up and move around while intentionally communicating with God. Prayer Walking can be done in any location at any time, sometimes alone or with a group.

 Walking a labyrinth is a meaningful meander, a meditative walk on a spiral path that, contrary to a maze, leads

you to the center then out again. Our bodies can move us into prayer when our mind has no clue where to go. We pray on the threshold as we begin, converse with God as we follow the pathway, spend time in the center, and follow the single path out.
