The Sun Rises: Capital Campaign Update

I have always been a morning person. After a good night's sleep, I enjoy nothing better than waking early, settling into my prayer chair with a cup of coffee and spending time communicating with God. With warmer days, I do this outdoors on the deck of the rectory.

Usually my prayer time revolves around journaling and spiritual reading, but I always begin with scripture. The psalms, especially, help me articulate what is resounding in my spirit. For example, Psalm 143:8 says, "Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I entrust my life."

This verse not only reminds me to rely on God in the affairs of my day, but has become my mantra for approaching the *One In the Light Campaign* of our new church property and building. That is, with trust. Trust that the entire process has been a demonstration of letting go and letting God be in charge.

From the onset of our existence as a parish back in 2010, we were given the invitation to trust the Holy Spirit. As hard as that has been at times, it's amazing how wonderful things have worked together.

It all started as Bishop Kinney asked us to merge and then invited us to consider worshipping in one space. From choosing a location, reflecting on our needs, listening to parishioners' hopes for the design and layout of the church ... I humbly admire all the ways this process has reflected our oneness and desires to *Love God. Live the Eucharist.*

As of May 15, we have \$1,938,035.00 pledged for the new church, with \$605,289.42 already received in cash. This will enable us to purchase the land and begin the process of moving our parish rectory to the new property. This will allow the current rectory on the South campus to be used for other purposes, such as classrooms and office space.



Ahoy! Summer is finally on its way. Make sure to register your kids for this year's fun-filled adventure, **Sunday, July 29—Thursday, August 2**, at COL-South from 5:00—7:30 PM. "Shipwrecked" is the theme of Christ Our Light Catholic Parish's five-day Vacation Bible School program. This program will be held in the evenings to accommodate families' busy schedules. In addition, because many families have weekend plans, we designed a *Sunday-Thursday* program. Please note this year's Vacation Bible School will be held at COL-South in Zimmerman.

Each evening will begin with a meal served at 5:00 PM. From 5:30—7:30 PM, the line-up of faith-based adventures will set sail: Castaway Sing and Play, Bible Discovery, Imagination Station, Shipwreck Games, Tropical Treats, and Sail Away Sendoff. Then the little sailors go home to their bunks, returning for the next day of high-seas fun.

Parents want their children to grow up strong in body, mind, and spirit. This year's Vacation Bible School theme is strong in building the child's Christ-based resilience. It emphasizes the message that Jesus will find us when life seems "shipwrecked." Jesus Christ will rescue us when we are lonely, when we worry, when we struggle. He wants to help us when we do wrong, and especially when we feel powerless. Jesus Saves!

We are now taking registrations for children entering Kindergarten through entering fifth grade. We are in need many youth volunteers as crew mates, so if you have a student entering sixth grade or older, please contact Wendy Rappé, Director of Faith Formation, or Matt Kehrer, Coordinator of Youth Ministry & Confirmation. Adult volunteers are also needed. There will be plenty of space on the island for kids, youth and adults to make this year's Vacation Bible School the best one ever!

Jump aboard! Registration forms are available in the main entrances of church at the kiosk and on the parish website. Cost is \$30.00 per child, or \$75.00 for a family with three or more children. Vacation Bible School is free for families with a parent volunteer. PLEASE NOTE: no family will be turned away because of finances. Registration is due to the parish on or before **July 13**.
