SOME NOTES FROM FR. ROBERTO

KEEP CHILDREN WARM! Each year, we collect warm clothes for children who are victims of sexual abuse. We need clothes (NEW or HOME-MADE only!), ages 3 to 16, boys and girls. Do NOT wrap; all must be inspected! Drop off at St. Francis Borgia Deaf center beginning 11/19! Sweaters, scarves, mittens, hats, coats, sweats/hoodies, warm socks.

HELP our DEAF BROTHERS & SISTERS. Each year, there is a Christmas Party for Disabled/Deaf adults at the Mabley Center in Dixon, IL. We will provide gifts for 50 residents of 110 this year. If you would like to purchase a gift, and give it to the Committee, they will bring it on Saturday, 12/9. You do NOT have to spend a lot of money. Ask Richard Kush for a sheet with the name of a person for whom you can purchase a Christmas gift.

Please ensure that all gifts are wrapped and labeled with the recipient's name and home (there are 7 different homes so it is very important they are labeled). If you are volunteering to buy a gift, please buy exactly what that person is asking for and if you wish you can add anything else but do not substitute the request. DRIVERS: It is dark earlier in the afternoons. Slow down, especially near schools and parks.

VETERANS: Saturday, November 11th was Veterans Day (celebrated Monday Nov 13 this year). The first name for this day was "Armistice Day" to remember all those soldiers who died during World War I. After World War II, the American government changed the name to "Veterans Day". It is important for us to remember the sacrifices so many men (and women!) made to keep our country free. Fr. Joe's great uncle, James Dunne, died on the last day of World War I, November 11, 1918. Who has served from your family in the military? All of us should pray for all those men and women who serve in the United States military right now. Pray also for their families.

Pray for military veterans. Many of them suffer from the effects of war, many years after the fighting has finished. Many soldiers from Viet Nam are sick and have died because of Agent Orange. Agent Orange was used to destroy jungles in Viet Nam. However, many of our own soldiers became infected, and are sick and dying from that years later. Many of the soldiers who have fought in Iraq, Afghanistan suffer from PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). PTSD causes many soldiers great emotional pain even years after they served, and often leads them to terrible depression, nightmares, and they commit suicide. Our Veterans deserve the best medical care possible. That is why we have the VA (Veterans Administration) hospitals and programs to help them. If you know someone who served in the military (or the family of those serving today), make sure to thank them, and promise you will pray for them.
