SOME NOTES from FR. JOE:

1) I am very concerned about what will happen to the rights of deaf people. It is VERY important that deaf persons remember their rights under the ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act).

LAW ENFORCEMENT & JUDICIAL SYSTEM: deaf persons have a right to COMMUNICATION. A deaf person can request a sign-language interpreter for ANY situation involving the police. A deaf person has a right to a sign-language interpreter in ANY situation involving the courts. What if a family member is hearing and the police arrest that person? The deaf person still has the right to a sign-language interpreter to understand what the police or the courts are doing.

GOVERNMENT AGENCIES: it does not matter which level of government the deaf person is involved in : city, village, county, state, federal government. If a deaf person requests a sign-language interpreter, the government office MUST provide for communication.

HOSPITALS/CLINICS: deaf people have the right to demand a sign-language interpreter for ALL COMMUNICATION in a medical situation. If you are a DEAF PARENT and your hearing child is in the hospital/clinic, you have a right to have an interpreter.

IF people refuse to get an interpreter, you must report this.
