

HOLY THURSDAY

First Reading

EXODUS 12:1-8,11-14

A Reading from the Scroll of Exodus

Moses and Aaron were in Egypt. The Lord said to them, “This month is to be the first month of the year for you. You must tell the people of Israel ‘On the tenth day of this month each man must choose either a lamb or a young goat for his family.’

If his family is too small to eat the whole animal, he must share an animal with his neighbor according to the number of people and how much each person can eat. You may choose either a sheep or a goat, but it must be a one-year old male without blemishes. Then on the evening of the fourteenth day of the month, the whole community of Israel will kill the animals. The people are to take some of the blood, paint it on the doorposts and above the doors of the houses that the animals are to be eaten.

The night the meat is to be roasted and eaten with bitter herbs and with bread made without yeast. You are to eat the meat quickly. You must be dressed for travel, with your sandals on your feet and your walking stick in your hand. It is the Passover festival to honor me, the Lord.”

Holy Thursday

On that night I will go through the land of Egypt, killing every first-born male, both human and animal and punish all the gods of Egypt. I am the Lord. The blood on the doorposts will be a sign to show the houses in which you live. I will see the blood and I will pass over it. I will not harm you but I will punish the Egyptians. You must celebrate this day as a religious festival to remind you what I, the Lord, have done. Celebrate it for all time to come.”

JOHN 13:1-15

A Reading from the Holy Gospel of John
