2) Do you ever stop in to the Blessed Sacrament Chapel at the rear of the Deaf Center? This is a quiet, wonderful place to spend time with God. Open every day: 6am-11pm.

4) TERRIBLE. Some of the people in the U.S. CONGRESS have no heart. Why? Because under the Social Security law, the U.S. government can transfer Social Security funds from the "General Fund" to the Disability Fund. HOWEVER, certain members of Congress are blocking this happening. Suppose they succeed and block the funds? This means that people who receive SSI, SSD, SSDI could possibly see their monthly check go down 20% each month.

Let your U.S. Congressional Representative know that you want Social Security to transfer needed funds into the "Disability Fund" of Social Security.

If you attend an interpreted Mass on Sundays, make sure you talk to your interpreters if you wish to attend a parish Lenten service, or to make sure about what masses will be interpreted throughout Lent/Holy Week/Easter.
