I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.







ALL: **Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.**


FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING FROM HOME: AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION:
