On **Friday, February 3rd** at Assumption Church, we will continue to observe the Nine First Friday devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus with First Friday devotions scheduled at **3:00pm**. This was the first devotion that Jesus, Himself, gave to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque with 12 Great Promises.

In the 12th Promise, Jesus said: "all those who will receive Holy Communion on the First Friday for 9 consecutive months, the grace of final repentance; they will not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving the Sacraments. My Divine Heart will be their safe refuge in that last moment." Do not pass this opportunity of grace, the invitation is yours...

3:00pm- First Friday Devotions

How to complete the 9 First Fridays devotion:

- 1) Receive Holy Communion (in the state of grace) on each First Friday;
- 2) The Nine First Fridays must be consecutive;
- 3) Holy Communion must be offered in honor & in reparation to His Sacred Heart.

THE PROMISE OF THE FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS

On December 10, 1925, Our Blessed Mother promised Sister Lucia (from Fatima) that she would "...assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation" all those who will fulfill her request by observing the Five First Saturdays.

How to complete the 5 First Saturdays devotion:

- † Go to Confession on the First Saturday itself or within eight days before or after
- † Receive Holy Communion (in the state of grace)
- † Pray five decades of the Rosary
- † Meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary -separate from praying the Rosary)
- The Five First Saturdays must be consecutive with the intention of making reparation for the 5 kinds of offenses & blasphemies against Mary's Immaculate Heart

What do you remember about your patron Saint that you chose for your Confirmation? Why did you pick that particular Saint? Did you like the name? Was it a Saint that was familiar to you? As the Saint reports come in from our Confirmation Candidates, I always enjoy reading the reports, especially the paragraph where they explain why this particular Saint was chosen.

There are so many reasons why our young people choose a particular patron Saint. They may relate to how the Saint lived their life, the patronages of the Saint, or just something about their particular Saint that spoke to them. But, there is one thing that all our candidates have done, and that is to really discern how they identify with their Saint, and how that particular Saint can be a spiritual help for them. I would like to share some parts of their Saint reports with you. I think you will be as impressed as I was with the depth of thought that went into the choices that were made.

"I picked this Saint because she (St. Anne) is the patron Saint of grandparents. I am very close to my grandparents and love to spend time with them. I like how she protects and watches over them. I also like that I can pray to her for their well being. I find it touching that there is a special Saint dedicated to them...I also want to be like Saint Anne. She devoted her life to our Savior and never backed out once. (Gabriella M.)

Anthony C. wrote "I picked this Saint because my middle name is William as well as my deceased grandfather. Since St. William was a baker, I also felt a connection since we have a few in our family too. A characteristic that St. William had that I value was the fact that he had the opportunity to journey through the Holy Land and I think that would be a neat journey to take once in my lifetime.'

Finally, Izabella N. wrote "Why I picked this Saint (St. Teresa of Calcutta) is because she showed me a lot of hope & inspiration. She did very hard work with great love and was someone that I can take an example from. The traits and virtues I would like to get at least a little from Mother Teresa are kindness, helping others, not being afraid to be around the ill, dying, and contagious people, and having courage and kindness the way she did.'
