

# The Governance of Assumption Parish

# The Sacrament of Baptism

Congratulations! We share in your happiness at the birth of your child. We welcome the new baby born into our world. A new life is a joyful and happy event, an event that changes people forever. A new life gives promise, hope and the expectation that the world will become a better place because of this new life. We want to help you in every way possible to make these hopes come true.

You have asked that your child be Baptized into the Catholic faith. In asking for Baptism you are saying "Yes" to the request of you and your family and promise help and guidance in the formation of this new life as a Christian.

# **Guidelines For Baptism**

Baptisms at Assumption Church are offered to all registered members of the parish and are currently celebrated after the 11:30 a.m. Sunday Masses. The common stipend for Baptism is \$50.00. Check may be made payable to The Church of The Assumption.

Attendance at a pre-Baptism class is required for all first time parents. These classes are held in January, May and September. It is a good idea to contact the rectory for class dates during the pregnancy in order to allow adequate time to schedule class before the desired Baptism date. Please call the rectory to schedule the Baptism and register for pre-Baptism classes.

At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic, and a registered active member of their church. This person must have a "Sponsor's Certificate" from his/her parish to be presented at the time of Baptism. The role of the Godparent during the ceremony has changed over the years, but their place in your child's life is most significant. They will support you and be a further example of Christian living for your child.

# The Sacrament of Marriage

The celebration of Marriage is a significant event in one's life. The Catholic Church looks at the occasion as the celebration of one of the seven Sacraments. It is essential that a couple planning to marry is well prepared. The Staff at Assumption parish is fully qualified and eager to guide and assist you in preparing you for married life and in making your marriage ceremony as holy, beautiful and memorable as you hope it could be.

# **Guidelines for Marriage**

It is recommended the couple reserve their date on the parish calendar before securing a reception venue. Couples are advised to contact the parish at least six months in advance of the desired date. Saturday weddings are typically scheduled at 11:00 a.m. and 1:00p.m.. The time for Friday evening weddings is flexible. The date should be set at least six months in advance. The couple or someone in their family must be a registered member of Assumption. The date can only be set by contacting the parish priest. The couple is responsible for obtaining a recent copy of their Baptism Record. They must also obtain a marriage license from the County Courthouse before the wedding day.

The Wedding Music Guidelines of the Diocese of Cleveland are followed here at Assumption without exception. This means that all musical selections before, during and after the Wedding Liturgy or Service must have religious content or lyrics based on Scripture. The Director of Music will meet with you and assist you in appropriate musical selection. He will also serve as organist/pianist for your special day. You should select a cantor from the list provided by the Director of Music.

Each couple is required to participate in one of the following premarital instruction programs:

**Pre-Cana:** These one-day sessions are held at many parishes in the Diocese, as well as the Jesuit Retreat House. You may attend at any parish. Each parish provides the details of its program upon request.

**Engaged Encounter Weekend:** These weekends are schedule by the Diocese on a regular basis. Further information regarding dates, place and cost are available upon request at the rectory office.

The suggested offering for a wedding is:

- \$500.00 cash/check payable to the Church of the Assumption.
- Clergy: \$100.00 Cash/Check payable to the Celebrant
- Servers: \$10.00 each Cash only

There are separate fees for the musicians as arranged by individuals. All fees must be presented at the rehearsal or another prearranged time.

This is just a summary of basic information. A more detailed guideline will be provided by the parish staff when planning your wedding ceremony.

# **Funerals**

Life and death are partners. At some point, all of us will face death. To lose a loved one through death always causes changes for us and for our lives. Life is about change. Sometimes it is painful. Sometimes it is beautiful. Many times, it can be both. Because of our relationship to Christ, new life comes through death.

#### **Guidelines for Funerals**

When you experience a death in your family, you may want to call the priest at the parish of the loved one who has passed away. He will offer prayers for the salvation of the deceased, as well as for the consolation of the family. Then you will need to contact the funeral home of your choice, who will work directly with the church to make arrangements for Mass.

A family member or funeral director should contact the rectory before any death notices are published.

Masses are typically scheduled Monday through Saturday at 10:00 a.m. Special arrangements can be made to meet unusual circumstances. There are NO funeral Masses during Holy Week or on Holy Days of obligation. (One exception: during Holy Week you may have a service including Liturgy of the Word and final commendations. A Memorial Mass may be celebrated at a later time.)

Ordinarily one of the parish priests will celebrate the funeral Mass. A priest relative may also be chosen to celebrate and/or give the homily. Other priests are always welcome to co-celebrate.

The parish is primarily responsible for scheduling and planning the liturgy which includes such things as the scripture readings, selection of music and designation of readers. A parish representative (priest, music director, etc.) will schedule a meeting either in person or by phone to assist family members in the selection of readings and hymns. All music must be liturgically appropriate.

Musicians and/or soloists will be provided by the music ministry of Assumption Parish. Outside musicians must be discussed with the music director first.

All stipends for the funeral are paid through the funeral home.

Stipends for a "Memorial Mass" should be paid directly to the Church of the Assumption. The usual stipend is \$250 for a Memorial Mass.

This is just a summary of basic information. A more detailed guideline will be provided by parish staff when planning the funeral Mass.
