



he season of *Advent* is a time of serious preparation not only physically for Christmas but also and more importantly for the coming of Christ, whether at the end of our lives, at the end of time, or daily in Holy Communion or in our prayer. With the shadow of COVID-19 in our lives to a certain degree this season, perhaps it is a good time to emphasize the spiritual side of Christmas even as

we prepare to celebrate the feast as best we can given the circumstances in which we find ourselves. With the onset of Advent, there are a number of prayers offered in preparation for Christmas. One of these was introduced to me by my grandmother many years ago. I keep it in my breviary and the card is quite old & worn. I shared it with you some years ago and

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant me desires, through the merits of Our Savior, Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother.

some parishioners have asked me to share it again, so here is it:

This prayer is to be said 15 times a day from the Feast of Saint Andrew (November 30) until Christmas (December 25).






A couple of weeks ago assessment data for 2022 became available from the NCES (National Center for Educational Statistics), and it showed Catholic schools achieving higher than the nation's public and charter schools, as they have in other years. However, this time the distance between sectors grew. While all schools faced the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, the results of Catholic schools - which were first to reopen and more likely to provide in-person options - also nationally outperformed their public and charter school counterparts when compared to past results.

As you can see from the graph provided by NCES the schools within the Diocese of Cleveland outperformed all public districts in Ohio. Assumption Academy falls right into line, showing an increase in test scores during this same time period. Those of us that are familiar with Catholic education know the value it brings in educating the whole

While the public schools in our neighborhood are focusing on how to recover from learning loss, Saint Albert the Great at Assumption Academy is focused on continued growth.

The Promise of the FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS

On December 10, 1925, Our Blessed Mother promised Sister Lucia (from Fatima) that she would "...assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation..." all those who will fulfill her request by observing the Five First Saturdays.

How to complete the 5 First Saturdays devotion:

- † Go to Confession on the First Saturday itself or within eight days before or after
- † Receive Holy Communion (in the state of grace)
- † Pray five decades of the Rosary
- † Meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary (separate from praying the Rosary)
- † The Five First Saturdays must be consecutive with the intention of making reparation for the 5 kinds of offenses & blasphemies against Mary's Immaculate Heart

On **Friday, December 4**th at Assumption Church, we will continue to observe the Nine First Friday devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus with First Friday devotions scheduled at **3:00pm**. This was the first devotion that Jesus, Himself, gave to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque with 12 Great Promises.

In the 12th Promise, Jesus said: "all those who will receive Holy Communion on the First Friday for 9 consecutive months, the grace of final repentance; they will not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving the Sacraments. My Divine Heart will be their safe refuge in that last moment." Do not pass this opportunity of grace, the invitation is yours...

3:00pm- First Friday Devotions

How to complete the 9 First Fridays devotion:

- 1) Receive Holy Communion (in the state of grace) on each First Friday;
- 2) The Nine First Fridays must be consecutive;
- 3) Holy Communion must be offered in honor & in reparation to His Sacred Heart.
