
TALENT OPPORTUNITIES BOOKLET



Dear Friends,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

I am pleased to present you with opportunities to participate in the stewardship and care of our parish through your time and talent. Our parish has many places for you to use your God-given talents to help bring the Gospel to every corner of our community. I invite you to take some time in prayer during this month to ask: What talents and skills has God given to you? How is God calling you to share your time, talents and skills for the good of our parish life?

Consider the parable that Jesus tells his disciples in Matthew 25:15-30. He tells them about a man who gave five, two or one talents to three of his servants. He gives them a huge amount and asks them to take care of it. Two of them use it and invest and earn their master more money. But the third one wastes it and buries it in the ground out of fear. The man is rightly pleased with the first two, but he becomes very angry with the third.

I ask you: **Do you have skills, talents, and gifts that you are wasting and burying in the ground?** I am confident that whatever talents you have – great or small – God can use in some way to help our parish bring Jesus into others' lives! We want to hear Jesus say at the end of our lives, "Well done, my good and faithful servant" because we have used the many gifts that He has given to us (Matthew 25:21).

What's a practical benefit to becoming more involved in the life of our parish? **You might make new friends!** This might sound cheesy and hokey at first. But the pandemic and all of its aftermath has taught us that many more people feel much lonelier than we are often willing to admit. Teenagers, moms and dads, and grandparents feel much more alone than we realize. If you use your variety of gifts here in our parish, you might meet someone who thinks like you, acts like you, and maybe even lives down the street from you!

This year I have a lofty and ambitious goal: I want 50% of our parish families to be involved in something in our parish in the coming year. As of this writing that means, 384 families should be involved in something in our parish! I know it's a big goal, but I think that we can do it. I ask that you complete the enclosed Sign-Up Form as you consider how you can share your gifts with our community throughout the year and return it at Mass on *March 2 or 3, 2024*. If you are unable to be at Mass that weekend, you may return the form to the Parish Office by *Monday, March 4, 2024*.

I am so grateful for all that you do in so many ways to help support and care for our parish! With God's grace and goodness, we can do great things and lead people to Jesus!
