12 Days of Christmas in the Catholic Church

1st day of Christmas - the Nativity of the Lord.

2nd day of Christmas - the Feast of St. Stephen, who died a martyr condemned unjustly.

3rd day of Christmas - the Feast of St. John the Evangelist.

4th day of Christmas - the Feast of the Holy Innocents, a day in which we remember all the innocent infants slain by King Herod as he looked for the newborn Messiah.

5th day of Christmas - the Feast of St. Thomas Becket, Bishop of Canterbury and martyr.

6th day of Christmas - the Feast of the Holy Family: Mary, Joseph, and Jesus.

7th day of Christmas - the Feast of (Pope) St. Sylvester and New Year's Eve in the secular calendar.

8th day of Christmas - the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, and New Year's Day.

9th day of Christmas - day in which we celebrate the Feasts of St. Basil the Great and St. Gregory Nazianzen.

10th day of Christmas - the Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, and the entire month of January is dedicated to His Holy Name!

11th day of Christmas - the Feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first person born in the United States to be canonized.

12th day of Christmas - the day before Epiphany. Also St. John Neumann's feast day. (January 5).

January 6 - Epiphany is the celebration of the revelation of Jesus as the Son of God – here on earth with us. The feast is also known as "Three Kings Day," the day the Magi visited Jesus in Bethlehem.

One Christmas my husband put an assortment of beauty products in my stocking. I tried one of the facial masks, and was about to wash it off when



Legislative - Loretta Terrana

As the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) gathered for its Fall Plenary Assembly in Baltimore, the bishops issued a Special Message addressing their concern for the evolving situation impacting immigrants in the United States. It marked the first time in twelve years that the USCCB invoked this particularly urgent way of speaking as a body of bishops. The last message of its kind was issued in 2013 in response to the federal government's contraceptive mandate.

In a vote of 216 votes in favor, 5 votes against, and 3 abstentions, the bishops overwhelmingly approved the Special Message, with sustained applause of the body following the vote.

In their message, the bishops wrote: "As pastors, we the bishops of the United States are bound to our people by ties of communion and compassion in Our Lord Jesus Christ. We are disturbed when we see among our people a climate of fear and anxiety around questions of profiling and immigration enforcement. We are saddened by the state of contemporary debate and the vilification of immigrants. We are concerned about the conditions in detention centers and the lack of access to pastoral care. We lament that some immigrants in the United States have arbitrarily lost their legal status. We are troubled by threats against the sanctity of houses of worship and the special nature of hospitals and schools. We are grieved when we meet parents who fear being detained when taking their children to school and when we try to console family members who have already been separated from their loved ones."
